Vermeil's not anxious for Birds to face Cards **By RALPH BERNSTEIN**

AP Sports Writer PHILADELPHIA (AP) - Philadelphia Eagles' coach Dick Vermeil says he doesn't like to play the St. Louis Cardinals in St. Louis

Who could blame him? Since Vermeil became head coach in 1976, the Eagles are 2-3 in St. Louis, and each victory was by just

our points. The Eagles went to the Super Bowl last season, but lost 24-14 to the Cardinals in St. Louis.

"They're a tough team at home," Vermeil said as he prepared his team to rebound from its 17-14 loss to Dallas last Sunday

The Eagles are 7-2, tied with the Cowboys for first place in the National Football League's National Conference East. They can't afford another slip, especially since they play the Cowboys in Dallas next

Vermeil described the Cardinals as unpredictable. He said they blow somebody out one week and get blown out the next.

Last week, St. Louis, 3-6, was routed, 42-21, by Washington. So, according to Vermeil's calculations. this is the Cardinals' week to howl. Vermeil also noted that the Cardinals have beaten both Dallas and away a winner against the Eagles.

Vermeil's remarks are obvious.

He wants his team to realize it isn' facing any soft touch just because of the won-lost record. The Eagles' defense will have to cope with Cardinals quarterback

Jim Hart, who has completed 120 of 214 passes for 56.1 percent efficiency. He's thrown 10 touchdown Hart's top receivers are wide re-

ceiver Pat Tilley, with 36 receptions for 517 yards and three touchdowns. and running back Ottis Anderson, who has caught 32 for 271 yards. Veteran wide receiver Mel Gray always is a threat.

On the ground, Anderson has gained 678 yards on 173 carries, and last week had his first 100-yard plus game of the season.

The Eagles' defense, which has kept them at the top of the NC East all season, will be without linebacker Reggie Wilkes, who is nursing oroken ribs. Vermeil, however, gets back John Bunting, a veteran linebacker who has been out five games with a hamstring injury.

The 31-year-old Bunting, who came back strong after knee surgery in 1978, said the defense can play better. He feels it has lacked consistency, hasn't been able to put together four quarters. Still, the Minnesota, the only teams to walk Eagles' defenders have allowed just 129 points, tied with Denver for the lead in that category.
