

### campus briefs

Fall Term enrollment at the University was the highest ever, said Robert E. Dunham, vice president for undergraduate studies, at the Nov. 20 meeting of the University Board of Trustees.

The president's instruction (including Commonwealth campuses) for Fall Term was 27,194, compared to 25,661 for Fall Term 1980, Dunham said. University Park enrollment increased from 32,704 for Fall Term 1980 to 33,786 last term.

Dunham said enrollment records were set at seven of the 16 Commonwealth campuses — Allentown, Altoona, DuBois, New Kensington, Schuylkill, Scranton and Wilkes-Barre.

The largest enrollment gains were in the College of Business Administration (14.6 percent), the Division of Undergraduate Studies (17.4 percent), the College of Engineering (9 percent) and the College of Science (6.5 percent).

Enrollment dropped in the Colleges of Agriculture (6.3 percent) and Education (7 percent).

Our record enrollments are partly due to the University's increased student-recruiting efforts," Dunham said. "But they are also due in part to our increasing retention of students. We're doing a better job of keeping our students than in the past."

Overnight parking will be prohibited in most University lots from Dec. 1 to March 15, the University parking coordinator said.

Allan A. Derzak said the winter-parking regulations are designed to keep lots open so snow removal crews can clear them. The regulations will be in effect even if snow is not on the ground, he said.

Signs stating "No parking 2:30 a.m. to 6 a.m." will be placed at the entrance of the lots affected.

Overnight parking will be permitted in areas not posted for snow removal, but vehicles must be moved by 7 a.m. if the area is not an open lot, Derzak said.

Open lots not posted for snow removal include Blue E, near the Computation Center; Red C, the gravel lot near the Pools Building; and Orange F, near the football practice field.

Lots that are off-limits for overnight parking are the Keller Conference Center parking area, visitor parking areas and the nursing education patient unloading area.

Tours of Patten will be offered today and tomorrow at 9 a.m., 11 a.m., 1 p.m. and 3 p.m. each day. An evening tour will be given at 7 p.m. tonight. All tours begin in the main lobby.

Tours of the branch libraries will be offered on the same dates. Undergraduate tours begin at 10 a.m. and graduate tours begin at 2 p.m.

Branch libraries include: Architecture Reading Room, 207 Engineering Unit C; Earth and Mineral Sciences, 105 Deike; Engineering, 325 Hammond; Life Sciences, 220 Patten; Mathematics, 110 McAllister Building; and Physical Sciences, 230 Davey Laboratory.

The French department has added a new technical writing and translation option, University Provost Edward D. Uddy announced to the University Board of Trustees.

The program leads to a bachelor of science degree and is for students who seek careers in business or government, he said.

"The program combines advanced proficiency in French with studies in French/English bilingual translation and technical writing," Uddy said.

An existing French Business Option combines business administration skills with foreign language competence.

Japanese 27A, the Japanese Writing System, will be offered second period on Thursdays this term. This is a one-credit course, and one term of Japanese is a prerequisite. All three types of writing — Hiragana, Katakana and Kanji — will be used in the course. Interested students should contact the Japanese program at 865-8960.

The Graduate School has announced two fellowship opportunities.

University employees must file a W-5 and/or RT-214 prior to Dec. 31 if they want to continue their exemption. These forms are available from the payroll department, 301 Shields.

University President John W. Oswald has endorsed a plan for the Forum on Black Affairs to gather statistical survey data on the status of black faculty, staff and graduate students at the University, said Howard Hall, forum vice president.

The survey plan is one of 11 recommendations made in the forum report, "Backing the Trend," which was the main topic of discussion for a meeting last term between Oswald and the forum, he said.

"It was a very positive meeting — we were very pleased," said Hall, who is also an assistant professor of psychology.

Oswald also agreed to appoint minority women to the 18-member Commission on Women.

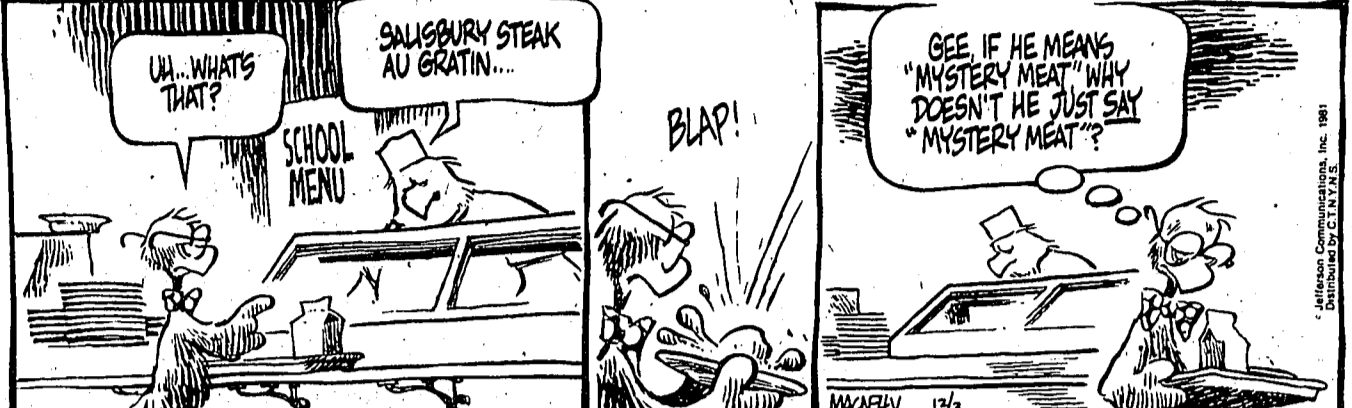

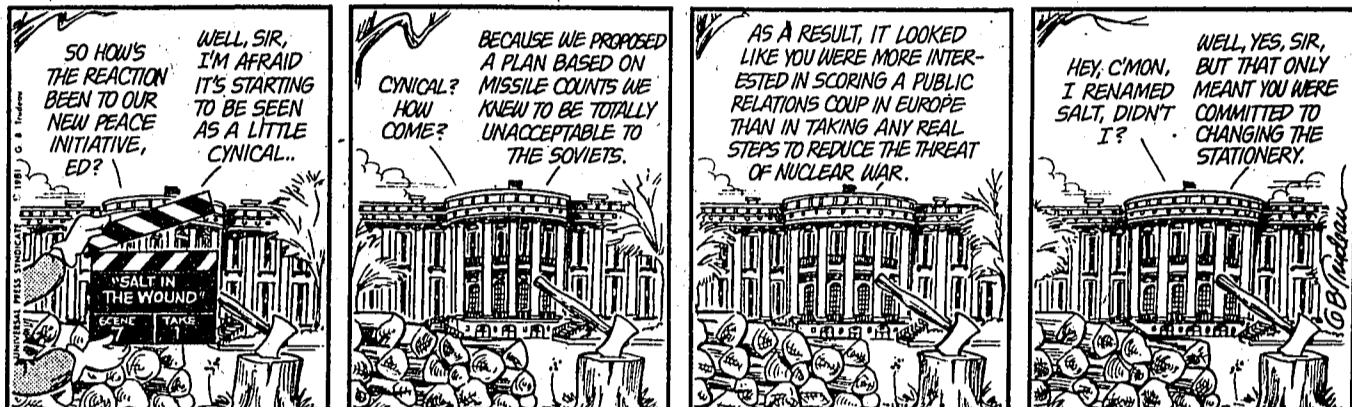

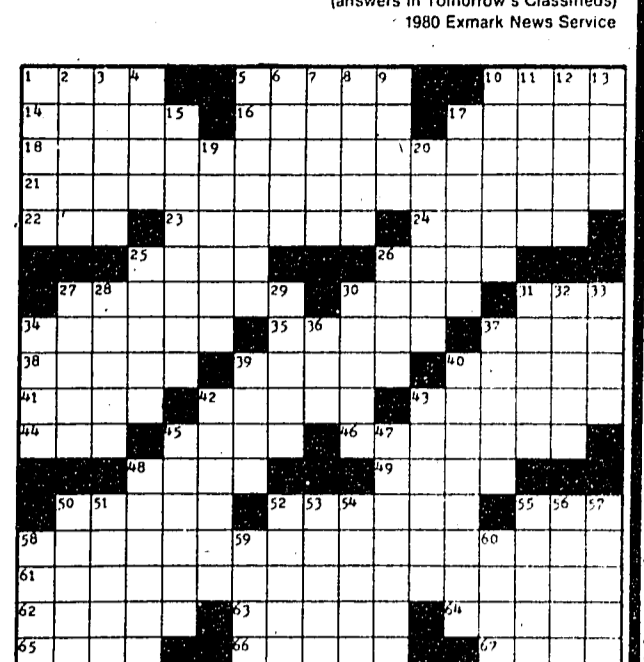
