

### Nancy gets a tree

WASHINGTON (AP) — A Christmas tree from Spartansburg, Pa., will grace the Blue Room of the White House, Nancy Reagan announced yesterday.

The 20-foot Christmas tree, valued at \$700 by the owners, was presented on the North Lawn of the White House.

The first lady received the 28-year-old Douglas fir from Eric and Gloria Sundback of Bethesda, Md. "I would love to accept that lovely big tree," Mrs. Reagan said. "I can't wait to see it all decorated."

The Sundbacks have 85 acres of Christmas trees in West Virginia and Pennsylvania.

Sen. John Heinz, R-Pa., greeted the Sundbacks and told Mrs. Reagan: "We hope this represents a comeback for all the Christmas tree growers in Pennsylvania."

The tree and the White House state rooms will be decorated in old-fashioned style this weekend by florists and other volunteers.

The Sundbacks also donated the White House Christmas tree in 1979. The honor is bestowed on the winner of the national championship growers' award, for which trees are judged on color, shape and other factors.

The Sundbacks also are providing 16 smaller trees to be used in decorating the White House.

### Holden will give \$250,000 to Powers

HOLLYWOOD (AP) — Actor William Holden bequeathed \$250,000 to his long-time companion, actress Stefanie Powers, with the bulk of his multi-million dollar estate to go to his family, according to his will filed yesterday in Los Angeles Superior Court.

Powers, who co-stars with Robert Wagner in the "Hart to Hart" television series, had had a longstanding romance with Holden, who was found dead Nov. 16 in his oceanfront apartment in Santa Monica.

Powers, who was on location at the time Holden's body was found, has said his death would leave an "unfillable void" in her life.

She suffered another tragic loss this week when Wagner's wife, actress Natalie Wood, drowned.

Holden and Powers had traveled widely together, to places including Africa, New Guinea and other parts of the world. But he had said before his death that their romance had cooled because of her heavy involvement in the series.

"A TV series is legalized slavery for the stars," Holden had said. "I just don't get to see her much when she is working."

### Amoeba parasite found in Erie bayfront

ERIE (AP) — The Erie County Health Department says a parasite that can cause a meningitis-like disease has been found in the city's bayfront. Studies are under way to determine if the amoeba can survive the winter weather.

Department director John Toth said in a telephone interview yesterday that the amoeba, called Naegleria fowleri, can cause death if its presence in the body is not detected quickly.

"It follows the olfactory nerve into the brain cavity," he said.

No cases of infection have been reported in the Erie area and the chances of contracting the disease are "slim," he said.

The amoeba has been found in warm water primarily in Southern states and more recently at warm water discharges of power plants elsewhere, Toth said.

It was discovered in Lake Erie last spring when the Pennsylvania Electric Co. was conducting an environmental study of its warm water discharge into the bay at the foot of State Street.

The Health Department asked the Erie County Council earlier this week to restore about \$2.50 million in next year's budget to continue studying the organism.

### NRC chairman tours Diablo Canyon plant

SAN LUIS OBISPO, Calif. (AP) — The head of the Nuclear Regulatory Commission said yesterday after touring the Diablo Canyon nuclear power plant, that he did not know if he would vote for a review of a study saying the \$2.3 billion facility was earthquake-safe.

NRC Chairman Nunnzio Palladino described the \$2.3 billion facility as "quite an impressive plant" with "a very fine technical support center."

"I'm just going to show that people can make mistakes and they've got to be caught before nuclear plants are licensed," he added.

On Nov. 19, after discovery of a number of design flaws, the NRC revoked a license it had issued to Pacific Gas & Electric Co. to conduct low-power tests at the facility.

He said flaws discovered so far involve the plant's design, not its construction.

"There are always questions of making sure that the (NRC) requirements are met and that the plants are properly constructed."

### Baker to attempt scheduling vote on extension of voting rights act

WASHINGTON (AP) — Majority Leader Howard Baker said yesterday he will attempt to schedule a Senate vote this month on a simple 10-year extension of the 1965 Voting Rights Act.

Key provisions of the law expire next August and proposals to renew it seemed likely to set off a major Senate battle next spring.

Supporters and many opponents of extending key provisions of the act agree that it has been the most successful of the civil rights laws enacted during the 1960s.

But there is fervent disagreement over whether some states should continue to be monitored as to whether they discriminate against black and other minority voters.

Under existing law, all or part of 22 states — many of them in the South — must come to the Justice Department for approval for changes in voting statutes or regulations.

Conservatives have argued that the so-called preclearance provisions should be extended to all 50 states, a proposal which critics say would have the practical effect of making the law unenforceable.

In October, in a major victory for civil rights organizations and liberal Democrats, the House approved a tough version which would extend the preclearance provisions indefinitely while setting stringent rules which would permit a state to get out from under the law by proving that it no longer discriminates against minority voters.

President Reagan previously supported extension of all 50 states, but said last month he will sign legislation which continues the current method of keeping close tabs on states which have a history of voter discrimination.

But the president has also indicated opposition to the tough provisions in the House bill which a state effectively could be excused from the pre-clearance requirement.

A simple extension of the existing law as proposed by Baker would eliminate that so-called bail-out provision.

A simple extension of the old law would also eliminate another section supported strongly by civil rights leaders.

The Supreme Court ruled that the Justice Department must show that local or state officials intended to discriminate or weaken the voting powers of blacks before they could bring a jurisdiction under the Voting Rights Act.

The voting rights extension approved by the House would eliminate the intent requirement only that the Justice Department prove that the effect of action be to discriminate against minority voters.

Continued from Page 1: "Is there an example in the world of an open agreement which details the number of tanks or armament that are stockpiled or (arrangements for) intelligence cooperation or infrastructure?" Sharon said.

"Israel has been struggling for 25 years against Soviet weapons, political influence and penetration of Arab states."

The debate turned stormy as Sharon accused the Labor Party opposition of spreading "gloom and despondency" and "systematically and maliciously undermining our consensus on national security."

With the sole aim of returning to power.

To outraged shouts from opposition benches, Sharon belittled his critics as "frustrated lawyers" and "retired generals with pretensions to leadership."

He denied the opposition's contention that the pact opened the way for Israeli troops to fight foreign wars, Israel's considerations would always be based on its own security needs, he said.

But with the agreement in hand, "Israel can defend itself in the gravest situation that can arise in the future," he said.

He said he saw nothing wrong with spelling out "the holy name of the threatener (the Soviet Union) in the agreement. What difference does it make if we say it is against the Soviet Union or against communism?"

This was in response to Labor's former foreign minister, Abba Eban, who argued that no similar treaty with any country had ever named the Soviets as a specific threat.

Eban charged that the pact obliged the United States to support Israel against the Soviets and their allies, but not against "the real danger" — the Arabs.

Shmuel member Amnon Rubenstein, in presenting a motion, said Israel "extorted the agreement from President Reagan on the basis of things he said in his election campaign... It (the United States) gave in to a campaign of pressure and pleas that would have embarrassed any sovereign nation."

Mer Winer, presenting the Communist motion, warned: "You'll still need the help of the Soviet Union which is so close to this area."
