

# Waldheim out of balloting

## Could still be re-elected, U.N. official says

UNITED NATIONS (AP) — Kurt Waldheim dropped out of the deadlocked balloting for secretary general yesterday but a U.N. official said the Austrian incumbent still could be re-elected for an unprecedented third term.

Waldheim's Third World challenger, Tanzanian Foreign Minister Salim Ahmed Salim, who also had been asked by the Security Council president to stand aside, declared himself still a candidate.

Waldheim met with Otunnu at noon and submitted a letter saying that, in view of the election stalemate "and in order to facilitate the task of the council, I would ask that my name not be included in further ballots the council may hold. A U.N. official who is close to Waldheim but refused to be named said the secretary general was ready to consider the council's decision on whether the Security Council to remain in office beyond the deadline of Dec. 31.

Ugandan Ambassador Oluara Otunnu, Security Council president for December, said that after 16 rounds of inconclusive balloting, which began more than a month ago, he had asked Waldheim and Salim "to step aside so we can consider other candidates and Waldheim committed himself."

China is committed to election of a Third World candidate and has consistently vetoed Waldheim. The United States has repeatedly vetoed Salim.

The question of withdrawing Salim's name from the balloting was discussed at a meeting of the group of African U.N. members in New York last week.

Otunnu said, referring to strong opposition within the council. "Nothing is completely ruled out. It might be possible for the council to arrive at a consensus."

This also opened the possibility that Waldheim or Salim could be picked at a meeting of the group of African U.N. members in New York.

Otunnu also reaffirmed that "I am still a candidate."

"There's no question of withdrawal," Algerian Ambassador Mohammed Bedjoui said after the Africans met.

## Murder may be drug related

After two months of interviews with more than 100 people, local police believe the murder of Thomas Kinser, 26, was drug related, said Police Chief Elwood Williams Jr. of the State College Police Department.

The Bureau of Drug Control has been cooperating in the investigation, Williams said, but no details could be released at this time.

On Dec. 14, 1980, Kinser disappeared from his State College apartment in Washington, D.C., has been used in a wooded area near Skimok in Harris Township on Sept. 7.

The FBI Crime Laboratory in Washington, D.C., has been used to assist in finding physical evidence at the crime scene, Williams said.

## Annual festival heralds season

Bright, traditional costumes, delectable international treats, unique arts and crafts, exhibits and films will be some of the major attractions of an International Fair held from noon until 6 p.m. Sunday in the HUB Ballroom as part of the eighth annual International Holiday Festival.

The opening ceremony for this "Inter-Cultural Celebration" will be held at 12:30 this afternoon in the Kern Creative Building lobby. The public is invited to all activities that are part of this 10-day long holiday event.

The festival chairmanship, which is alternated yearly between James F. Lynch Jr., assistant director for International Student Affairs, and John A. McCauley, assistant director of student activities, will be handled this year by McCauley.

"The University community will come out, and we never have doubts about the international community coming out," McCauley said. "We think our promotion has been better, and we hope we'll draw significant numbers of Americans."

"Where else can you go to get food from 15 different countries?" McCauley said.

McCaughey said the committee charged with organizing the festival has been working since early Fall Term. The festival began eight years ago in an attempt to consolidate the diverse international activities that occurred at different times throughout the year and were much more low key, McCauley said.

"We had a number of smaller events in previous years. A lot of international clubs would have a dinner once a year and show films," Lynch said. "We saw that there was definitely a market for a larger event."

The International Fair, in its fourth year, is the major attraction of the festival, Lynch said.

The attendees at the fair has increased every year, rising from between 800 and 900 in 1978 to about 1,500 people last year, Lynch said. The fair is popular with students as well as town residents, and over the years has developed a following.

"People call as early as September and say, 'Are you going to have that thing again?'" Once a person comes the first time, they want to come back," Lynch said.

However, the Fair is not the only event of the International Holiday Festival. Sunday will also feature a "Messiah Sing-In" featuring the University Choirs, the Lutheran Student Parish and the Nittany Valley Symphony at 3 p.m. in Schwab Auditorium.

Exhibitions including "Art of the Contemporary American Indian" in the HUB Gallery and the "International Artifacts Sale" in the Kern Lobby will be displayed through Dec. 18, and a laser photography and Art Print Sale will be held next week in the HUB Gallery.

Monday and Tuesday will include nighttime concerts of international music in the Kern Lobby. Also on Monday, Dec. 14 in Kern, Tuesday, a children's Christmas party will start at noon in Walnut Building and an international coffeehouse will be held at 8 next Saturday night in 102 Kern.

The public is invited to meet at 8 p.m. on Dec. 13 in Eisenhower Auditorium to join in Christmas caroling around campus, the concluding event of the International Holiday Festival.

The organizations coordinating events in the International Festival are: Graduate Student Association, Hetzel Union Board, International Council, Kern Graduate Commons, Office of International Student Affairs, Office of Religious Affairs, Office of Student Activities, Paul Robeson Cultural Center, and Residential Life Programs. The University Committee on International Programs has also contributed to the festival.

On the order, filed Nov. 13, states that all of the contents of the restaurant are to be sold to satisfy the debt levied by Centre County Sheriff Richard W. Waite and nothing can be removed without the sheriff's permission. The Sub Shack is located at 484 E. College Ave.

Sunbury Wholesale Seafood Company filed a \$1,830.23 order for unpaid debts against the sandwich shops owner, Seato A. Fabri.

Fabri, 55, was found dead Nov. 25 in his brother's cabin near Woodland Lake in Pike County. Multiple degenerative blows to his head and body were the cause of death, Pike County Coroner James Martin said.

Cathy Ann Olszowski, 17, 2004 N. Altherston St., was charged as an adult with criminal homicide, two counts of theft and unauthorized use of a motor vehicle, the Pike County Police Department said.

Olszowski was arraigned last week before Magistrate Carolyn Purdie, Millard Township, and held without bail at the State Correctional Institute at Muncy. She was apprehended by State Police after she allegedly took \$300 from Fabri and left the scene in Fabri's 1974 Pontiac, police said.
