University students will soon be able to breath more freely. Well, not really.

The state is pumping \$6.4 million into the renovation of the campus power plant to bring the facility into compliance with clean air laws.

The construction of the new smoke stack behind the plant, located at the corner of South Burrowes Street and West College Avenue, is the first phase in that renovation, said John Miller, director of physical plant development.

The quality and quantity of emissions from the existing facility are in violation of state and federal clean air regulations, Miller said.

John Slade, Williamsport District supervisor of the state Department of Environmental Resources, said two emissions regulations were applicable in the case of the University power plant: opacity how thick the smoke is — and particulate emissions. The emissions vary because the University's boilers can burn coal, oil and natural gas, but at times the plant's emissions were well above the acceptable levels, Slade said.

The state DER has exempted the University from fines for the emissions violations until the project is completed, he said, but explained that fines for violations can be as high as \$10,000 for the initial discovery and \$2,500 for each day of violation after that.
