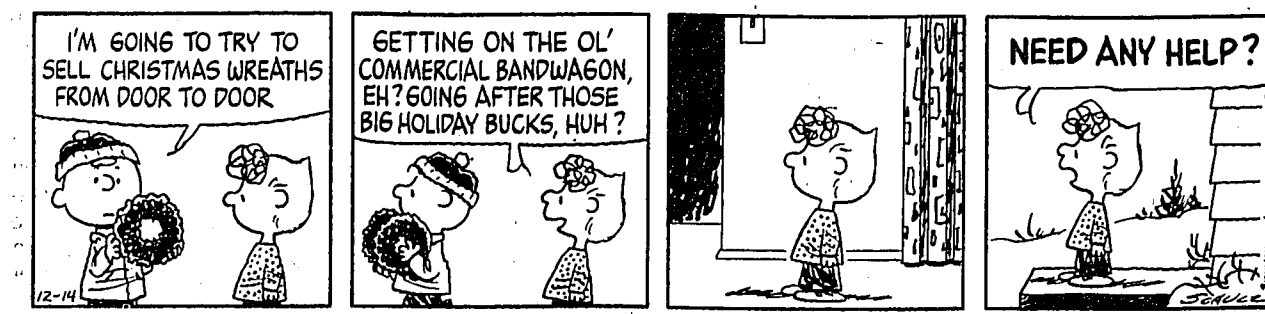
• University Readers will sponsor a reading of Charles Dickens' "A Christmas Carol" at 7:30 tonight in 101 Kern.

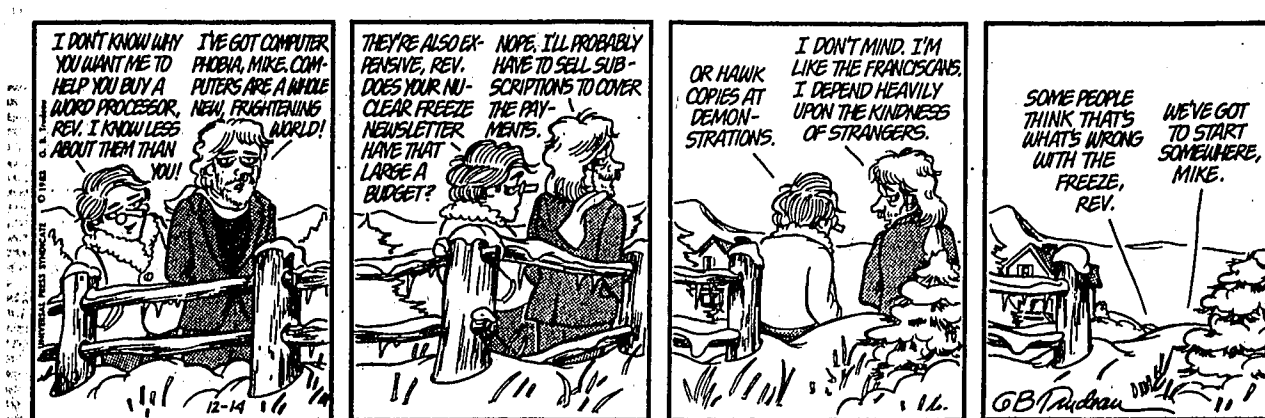

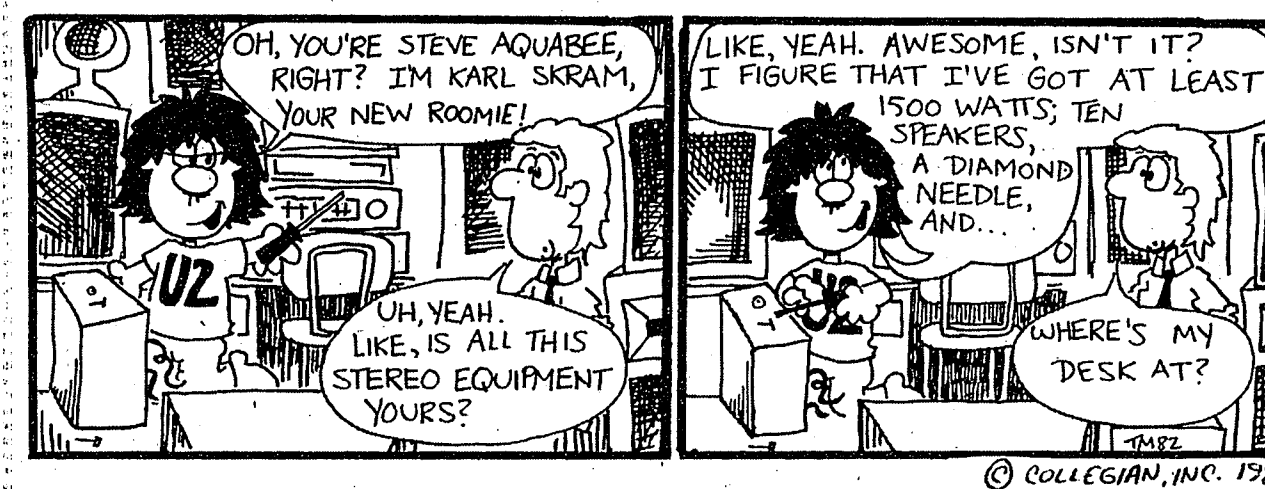
