Bob Hope goes to work in bed

Comedian Bob Hope, describing the decor of his hospital room as "Early Kremlin," went to work on details of his Christmas special from his bed yesterday, a spokeswoman said.

But there was no word on whether doctors would allow the 79-year-old Hope to travel to Lebanon to entertain American troops for Christmas.

Hope was hospitalized Wednesday night for tests on his hemorrhaging right eye.

The comedian has been suffering periodic blurry vision and had difficulty reading the cue cards in his last TV special.

Liz, John sued by dog-bitten doctor

A Boston doctor who claims he was bitten by a dog owned by Sen. John Warner, R-Va., and his former wife, actress Elizabeth Taylor, has filed a \$250,000 lawsuit.

The suit was filed in U.S. District Court on Wednesday by Dr. Edward F. McGrath, who contends that he suffered "severe personal injury," pain and mental anguish and lost income.

McGrath's attorney, George J. Shapiro, said the physician was visiting relatives near Warner's farm in Middleburg, Va., in December 1980 when the dog bit him several times in the leg.

Brennan home for the holidays

Actress Eileen Brennan will be home for the holidays, released from a hospital seven weeks after she was struck by a car and suffered skull, leg and facial fractures.

Officials at Daniel Freeman Marina Hospital said the 48-year-old actress is almost back on her feet and will be released from the hospital Friday to complete her recuperation at home.

Brennan, who portrays the no-nonsense Army Capt. Doreen Lewis in both film and television versions of "Private Benjamin," plans to hold a hospital news conference at 10:30 a.m. Friday, Burditch said.

She was injured Oct. 27, when she was hit by a car.

Town proves more than one can be first

KINGSTON, Okla. (AP) — In this tiny community in southern Oklahoma, the question is not just who's on First, but which First you're talking about.

In Kingston, a community of 1,100 residents, there are three First streets and three Second streets. There are also two Oak streets, a couple of Main streets and a half-dozen other streets with similar names.

City officials said the problem dates back to the early days of the town. When someone built a house, he just named the street in front of it whatever he pleased, they said.

The town council has set up a joint committee with the area Chamber of Commerce to solve the problem.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (AP) — Florida has yet to see a snowfall this winter, but the students of Bolles School were greeted yesterday by a 7-foot snowman smuggled in from the mountains of Tennessee.

Florida grape grower Esmond A. Grosz II brought the snow in a utility van 600 miles from the Smoky Mountains.

"When I was growing up in Phoenix, Ariz., our high school had a snowman every year," Grosz said.

"We would go up to Flagstaff on Mount Aggie to about the 8,000 foot level and load a truck with snow. I always said when my little boy got to high school, I would do the same for him."

Acting fast before the snow melted, Grosz and his son, Esmond III, a Bolles student, started building the snowman — with pepper-shaker eyes and a carrot nose — about 5 a.m. under a covered walkway.

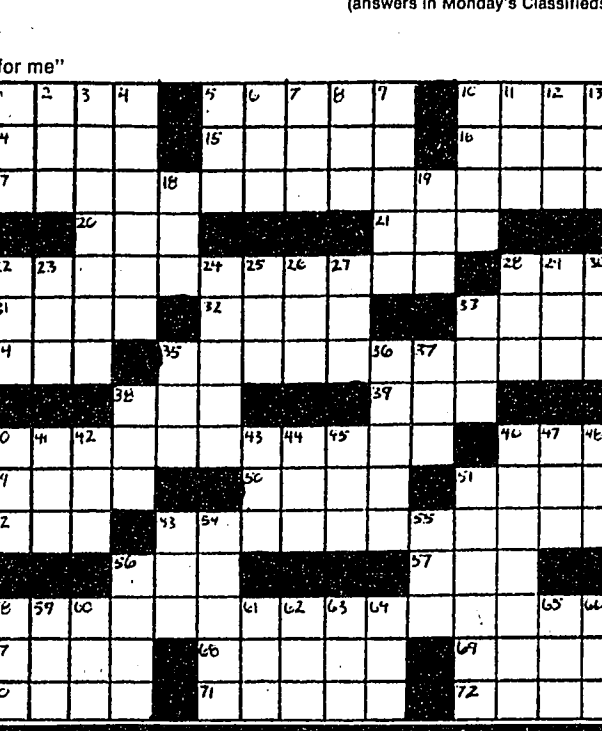
