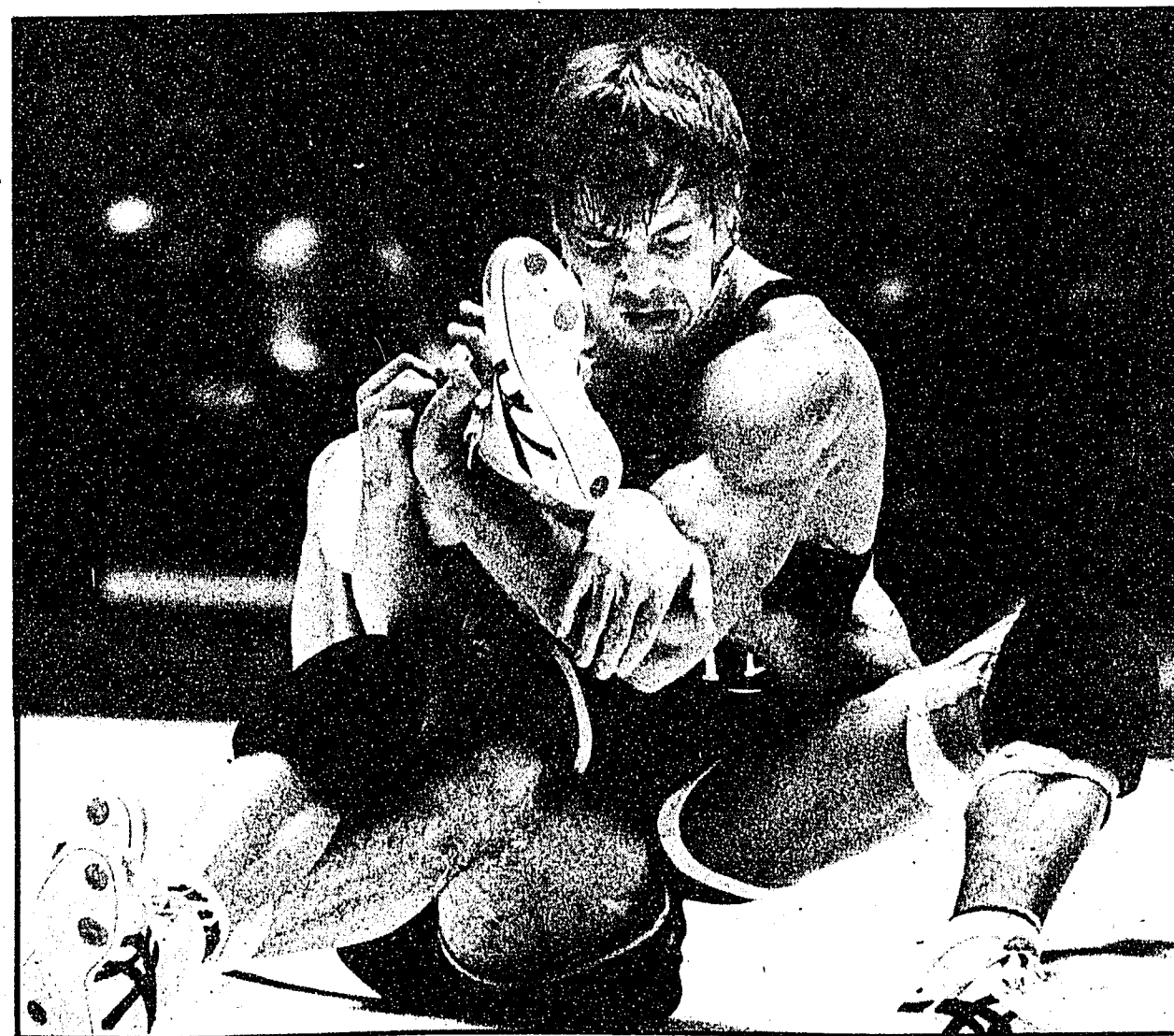
Carefully handcrafted, realistic birds carved and painted by Bill and Grace White fill the display cases through Jan. 28.
