194 ABLED advances the needs, understanding, and welfare of handicapped persons in the University and aids their integration into society.

195 ACCOUNTING CLUB stimulates interest in the various accounting fields and brings experienced viewpoints from the business world to the students.

196 ACTUARIAL SCIENCE CLUB contributes to better public understanding and appreciation of actuarial science problems.

197 ADVERTISING CLUB provides an opportunity for students considering advertising as a career to share their interest and participate in activities and projects related to their academic and professional goals.

198 AG MECHANIZATION CLUB promotes the interests of students concerned about Agricultural Mechanization, particularly as these interests relate to their personal and professional advancement.

199 AGRONOMY CLUB stimulates an interest in agronomy and encourages cooperation and friendship between the students and the staff through a variety of social activities and field trips.

200 AIKIDO CLUB teaches members non-violent self-defense techniques useful for attaining a dynamic unity of body and spirit.

201 AIR FORCE ROTC DRILL TEAM develops leadership, comradeship and pride through drill preparation and competition.

202 AMATEUR RADIO CLUB offered in the College of Engineering, holds ham radio contests, conducts ham radio license classes, handling of emergency radio messages, and exchanges technical information to increase the knowledge of radio and electronics.

203 AMERICAN HELICOPTER SOCIETY engages in educational and scientific activities to advance the theory and practice of the sciences of helicopters and other aircraft in the area of vertical take off and landing and similar devices.

204 AMERICAN HOME ECONOMICS ASSOCIATION sponsors a variety of programs aimed to incorporate the field of Home Economics with all the other majors in the College of Human Development.

205 AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF AERONAUTICS AND ASTRONAUTICS provides information on current activities in aerospace engineering through guest speakers, films, and field trips to various air and space centers.

206 AMERICAN INSTITUTE OF CHEMICAL ENGINEERS invites guest speakers from industry to advance chemical engineering in theory and practice and to promote high professional standards.

207 AMERICAN METEOROLOGICAL SOCIETY (Penn State Chapter) fosters interest in the Meteorology Department and the staff through a variety of activities for undergraduates as well as creates to listen and talk to experts in the science.

208 AMERICANS FOR DEMOCRATIC ACTION supports issues of a liberal nature and educates the community regarding these issues through the distribution of information and by providing assistance to candidates who support those issues.

209 AMERICAN NUCLEAR SOCIETY promotes fellowship, knowledge, and professional contacts with nuclear science, engineering, and related fields.

216 ANTHROPOLOGY PROMOTION AND ENRICHMENT SOCIETY assists in the social and educational development of students in anthropology through programs, involving speakers from both within and outside of the department, workshops, and social activities.

217 ARMY TANG SOO DO HAPKIDO promotes physical fitness through skill and discipline advancement of the martial arts.

218 ASSOCIATION OF STUDENT HEALTH PLANNERS AND ADMINISTRATORS provides program experiences for Health Planning Administration majors.

219 ASTRONOMY CLUB is a social and educational club which makes available astronomical instruments owned by the Department of Astronomy.

220 BIOLOGICAL SOCIETY gains a better understanding of the biological sciences through meetings, field trips, society publications, and social activities.

221 BLACK STUDENT UNION has as its purpose to help bring the black community into the mainstream of Penn State residential life.

222 BRIDGE CLUB provides opportunities for developing skills and learning principles of the game of bridge.

223 CAMERA CLUB maintains the darkroom on the ground floor of the HUB, and makes available its equipment (complete black and white facilities and limited color facilities) and offers instruction in different areas of photography.

224 COLLEGIATE FUTURE FARMERS OF AMERICA develops competent and aggressive agriculture leadership and participates in activities related to the improving agriculture.

225 4-H CLUB advances and influences 4-H work and provides recreational and educational activities for interested students.

226 CIRCLE K provides leadership training and service opportunities on campus and in the community, working with campus officials and the parent Kiwanis Club in State College.

227 CLUB MANAGER'S ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA introduces to its members various aspects of Club Management through guest speakers and tours of a variety of clubs.

228 COLLEGE CONSUMER PARTY educates the community about the Party's principles through the distribution of printed information and by guest speakers and works for the election of Consumer Party candidates.

229 COLLEGE REPUBLICANS meet with government officials from all levels and become involved in county government by organizing car pools to voting polls, handing out literature, and aiding in the election process.

235 COUNCIL FOR EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN promotes the advancement of education of exceptional children through programs designed to increase public awareness and acceptance, provides services for exceptional children, and promotes the exchange of ideas.

236 DAIRY SCIENCE CLUB encourages student interest in dairying through annual events such as the Dairy Expo and the Collegiate Cattle Judging Contest, and engages in various fund raising activities.

249 FRONTLASH is a vehicle for youth participation in politics by voter registration campaigns, political and labor education, and coalitions.

250 GEOLOGICAL SCIENCES CLUB stimulates interest in the geological sciences and organizes field trips and education programs.

251 GERMAN CLUB organizes and hosts the annual Oktoberfest and Faschingsball events and provides opportunities to speak German and learn more about German culture.

252 HAP CLUB publishes a graphics oriented magazine which provides an outlet for student art and graphic achievements.

253 HISTORY ROUNDTABLE provides a forum for interaction between faculty and students concerning the study of various aspects of history.

254 HOMOPHILES OF PENN STATE (HOPS), 212 HUB, makes an effort to educate the University community of alternative lifestyles available to individuals, and provides social activities and the HOPS Gayline, nightly from 7:30 p.m., 883-0588.

255 HORTICULTURE CLUB establishes and develops a split of unity, friendship and interaction between students and faculty members of the Department of Horticulture. Activities include the annual Hort Show on Homecoming weekend.

256 HOTEL AND RESTAURANT SOCIETY supplements the FSHA program and provides social activities. It also provides experience for the development members through its catering service.

257 HOTEL SALES MANAGEMENT ASSOCIATION fosters the development, maintenance, and improvement of sound business practices through guest speakers. Annually, it sponsors two trips to hotels and resort areas to conduct sales or operations analysis.

258 INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY STUDIES UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT ORGANIZATION conducts workshops, participates in service projects, conducts a job search for senior members and works in union with the commonwealth campuses.
