

Student dies soon after her roommate

The roommate of a University student who died from heart failure Feb. 3 was found dead in her apartment last Thursday morning, an apparent suicide victim, the county coroner said Friday.

Gail Ann Blumberg (junior-special education), 23, of 458 E. College Ave, Apt. 206, was found after State College police entered the apartment.

Blumberg was pronounced dead at 10:25 a.m. Thursday by Centre County Coroner Robert Neff.

Neff said the preliminary cause of death was suicide due to prescription drug overdose.

Blumberg was the roommate of Lisa Koper, a student who died of heart failure in Chambers Building on Feb. 3.

Noise problem may be solved at demonstration

Although the upcoming noise demonstration may resolve the decibel problem, the demonstration is not without flaws, Interfraternity Council President Adam Levinson said during the organization's meeting last night at Kappa Sigma fraternity, 255 Highland Drive.

During the demonstration, scheduled for 3 p.m. Feb. 23 at Alpha Sigma Phi fraternity, 328 E. Fairmount Ave., Levinson said a stereo speaker will be placed in a window, and a group of students and residents will decide on a reasonable decibel level. Levinson said he will be bringing up some negative points of the demonstration, such as why a speaker is being placed in a window when it is illegal to do so.

Levinson emphasized the importance of student, and especially Greek, participation in the demonstration since fraternities are often

cited for noise violations.

As the plans for the 1984 Dance Marathon are being finalized, John Hishta, overall marathon chairman, thanked all fraternities that participated in the organization of the marathon.

He also said fraternity response to the Dance Marathon Kickoff Dinner, which will be held tomorrow night at Gatsby's, was disappointing because only four fraternities are sending their marathon representatives to the dinner. Tickets are still available and may be purchased in 216 HUB, Hishta said.

Speeches were also presented last night by the candidates for IFC president, administrative vice president and secretary/treasurer. Elections for these offices will be held during the next IFC meeting Feb. 27 at Pi Lambda Phi fraternity, 622 W. College Ave.

Candidates for IFC president are Maury Billig of Pi Kappa Alpha and Paul Blahusch, Alpha Chi Rho.

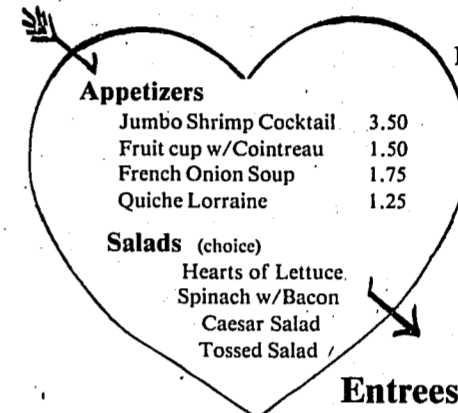
