Masters could provide golf's next No. 1

AUGUSTA, Ga. — It is possible that the Masters could provide a sense of definition, a sense of direction that is lacking on the pro golf tour. Tom Watson's slump over the last year or so has robbed the game of the presence of a dominant player.

There is no No. 1 The title is vacant.

It has happened before

Last year, for the first time in history, no one won more than two events on the American tour. The 13 tournaments held earlier this year have done nothing to clarify the situation.

The close examination of golfing skills and ability, the test of nerves and desire that is the Masters could provide a clue as to identity of the man who would succeed.

It was on the flowered hills of Augusta National that the young Arnold Palmer built so much of his reputation. It was three Masters triumphs in a 4year period that confirmed the ascendency of the

voung Jack Nicklaus. * It was at the Masters, in 1977, that the torch was passed again, this time to Watson, who broke a tie with Nicklaus with a birdie on the 71st hole. That it was the start of the Watson era was

confirmed three months later in the British Open.

But Watson has been in a slump for the last 11/2

years. He has been unable to exert his authority. But then, neither has anyone else. So it is to the Masters that golf turns in search

of a leader. Perhaps even more important is a larger question: will there ever again be a clear leader, an unquestioned No. 1 in the game? Has the era of the great stars come and gone?

"Someone always will be No. 1. Someone always will have the game and the courage and the desire to get to the top of the heap," Watson said.

Others wonder. "There are so many good players now, I don't think we'll ever see anyone dominate the game like Watson did for the last few years, like Jack

and Arnold did," said Lee Trevino. "There are so many good players, the depth of the talent is so great, that it may not be possible for any one player to win often enough to dominate like they used to," Trevino said.

"I don't know if the star system is dead," said PGA Tour Commissioner Deane Beman. "I hope not. Golf needs it's great stars, the outstanding players that are recognizable to the public. "But we don't yet have enough facts available to say, one way or another, just what the situation






