

Clark's single leads Giants past Bucs

Jack Clark's bases-loaded one-out single in the bottom of the 10th inning cracked a tie and gave the San Francisco Giants a 2-1 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates in major league baseball action yesterday.

"Clark wasn't the guy I'd want up there," Pirate reliever Kent Tekulue conceded following his 19th debut. "I made what I thought was a pretty good pitch, down and on the inside half of the plate. He hit it on the ground, but not at somebody."

In other National League action, Andre Dawson drove in four runs to pace Montreal to a 9-3 victory yesterday over the Cincinnati Reds.

Montreal's Pete Rose, who is one hit shy of 4,000

in his career, walked in the first, second, fourth and eighth innings, and hit a bouncer back to the mound in the sixth. He scored the Expos' first run, drawing the first walk from Bruce Berensky, 9-2, and coming around on Bryan Littio's double and Dawson's grounder.

Dawson was credited with an RBI when he was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded in the fourth. Then the outfielder walloped a two-run double in Montreal's four-run eighth to complete the scoring. Bryan Smith, 2-0, was the winner for Montreal, scattering six hits over six innings as the Expos halted a three-game losing streak.

The Expos cashed in on 10 walks by three Reds pitchers.

"In the eighth, we had allowed only (six) hits, but

in nine walks and one intentional walk," Reds Manager Vern Rapp said. "That's 10 times you can't get somebody out."

Although Rose got loud ovations from the expectant fans, he swung only twice, on a foul ball and his groundout.

"When I'm ahead in the count, I'm not going to swing at a borderline pitch," he said.

Mookie Wilson and Hubie Brooks drove in two runs apiece and Walt Terrell and Doug Sisk combined on a five-hitter to give the streaking New York Mets a 6-1 triumph over the Atlanta Braves in a two-night game. The victory was the sixth straight for the Mets, whose 6-1 record is the best start in the team's 25-year history.

Tripucka scores 38 in Pistons' rout of Sixers

PHILADELPHIA (AP)— Kelly Tripucka found himself getting stronger as the game went on—much to the disappointment of the Philadelphia 76ers.

Tripucka scored 38 points, including 29 in the second half, and Fishback added 23 to lead the Detroit Pistons to a 128-113 NBA victory over the 76ers last night.

It was the first Detroit victory in Philadelphia since Nov. 2, 1974.

"I've been getting more minutes than last year," Tripucka said after the game. "And I always do well when I have a lot of minutes in the game. I get stronger as the game goes on. I wear down my opponent, and I begin making the shots."

Thomas, who held scores in the first quarter, credited the Detroit defense. "Our defense was able to sustain us tonight until Kelly and I got going in the second half," he said.

Philadelphia Coach Billy Cunningham said Tripucka played his best game ever against the 76ers, while Thomas "did whatever he wanted to do out there."

"I'm concerned about our concentration," Cunningham said. "For us, it's not a matter of x's and o's. We just need to regroup mentally."

The 76ers also got another blow, learning that reserve forward Bobby Jones, often called the league's best sixth man, might miss the rest of the season because of a leg injury.

The victory, the second in a row and 10th in the last 13 games for Detroit, kept the Pistons tied for first place in the Eastern Conference's Central Division with Milwaukee, a 108-95 winner over Cleveland yesterday.

Detroit, 48-32, went ahead for good 33-22 when Thomas made one of two free throws with 8:48 left in the second quarter. The Pistons led 53-44 at halftime.

The 76ers made a change in the third period when Julius Erving scored 10 points. His two free throws with 3:48 left in the period knotted the score at 71.

But the Pistons drove away, outscoring the Sixers 13-2 to lead 84-73 with 1:13 left in the third period. The Pistons gained their biggest lead of the game, 16 points, on an Earl Cureton dunk that made it 101-85 with 7:06 left.

The closest the 76ers got in the fourth quarter were eight points.

Andrew Toney led Philadelphia with 27 points.

"North Carolina has a good team and Ohio State is always strong so

we'll have to play well to win some games," Rankin said.

The third team the Lady Lions will face, Virginia, has already beaten them twice this year but Rankin is happy to see the Lady Cavaliers again.

"I'm glad they're in our bracket," she said, "we want some revenge."

Rankin and her squad felt they gave Virginia the two wins with its own shoddy defensive play. She said that type of play into the weekend will decide how they fare in the tournament.

agrees. She said improving the glove play is a top priority going into this weekend's action.

"First, we have to get our defense back together," she said, "that will be the key. The hitting will come around because playing good defense builds confidence."

The Lady Lions started down that path on Tuesday with a sweep of Ithaca. They played errorless ball in the two games. Whether they continue that type of play into the weekend will decide how they fare in the tournament.
