

### Anderson set to endorse Mondale at rally today

WASHINGTON (AP) — John B. Anderson, who organized an independent presidential campaign against Ronald Reagan and Jimmy Carter in 1980, is set to endorse Democratic presidential nominee Walter F. Mondale.

There is also a possibility that the National Unity Party that Anderson heads will nominate Mondale, and thus provide him with about \$7.8 million in public funds, according to knowledgeable sources.

A Mondale campaign official, who spoke on condition he not be identified, confirmed that Anderson will endorse Mondale when the Democratic nominee appears at a rally at the University of Illinois today.

However, Mondale aides said no arrangement had been discussed under which the Anderson party would provide the Mondale organization with money. More than 7 per cent of the vote cast in 1980 went to Anderson, although he peaked at about 30 per cent in public opinion polls taken early in the campaign.

vacuum created by many voters dissatisfied with both Carter and Reagan. But there is no such vacuum this year, and last spring Anderson announced that he would not run again in 1984.

He did, however, say he would go ahead with formally organizing the third political party.

More recently, sources said, Anderson has been talking with Mondale directly about a public endorsement. Meanwhile, Mondale's aides and former Wisconsin Gov. Patrick J. Leehey, who was Anderson's running mate in 1980, have been negotiating about the possible third party nomination which would be voted in much the same way as the Liberal Party in New York state supports Democratic candidates.

## Miami edges No. 1 Auburn in 'classic' game

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. — Bernie Kosar passed for 329 yards and two first-half touchdowns and freshman Greg Cox kicked a pair of field goals, including the game-winning 25-yarder with 6:08 remaining, as defending national champion Miami stunned No. 1-ranked Auburn 20-18 last night in the second annual Kickoff Classic.

The victory in the first college football game of the season made a winner of Jimmy Johnson in his debut as Miami's head coach and stretched the Hurricanes' winning streak to 12 games, longest in the nation.

Although Miami won the 1983 national championship by edging No. 1-ranked Nebraska 31-30 in the Orange Bowl, the Hurricanes were and eight yards to flanker Stanley Shakespeare in the first 20 minutes, fourth-quarter field goals of 45 and 25 yards by Cox and a rebuilt but fierce defense that held Bo Jackson, Auburn's All-America halfback, to 96 yards on 30 carries.

Meanwhile, Miami got 140 yards on 21 rushes from sophomore Quarterback Brent Fulwood and Auburn's last threat in a see-saw fourth quarter when defensive end Julio Cortes recovered a fumbled pylon pass from the Tigers' Brent Fulwood at the Auburn 49 with 2:57 left to play. The game ended with Miami on the Auburn 2-yard line, where Kosar, who completed 21 of 38 passes, let the clock run out.
