Soviets object to virtually every item on draft

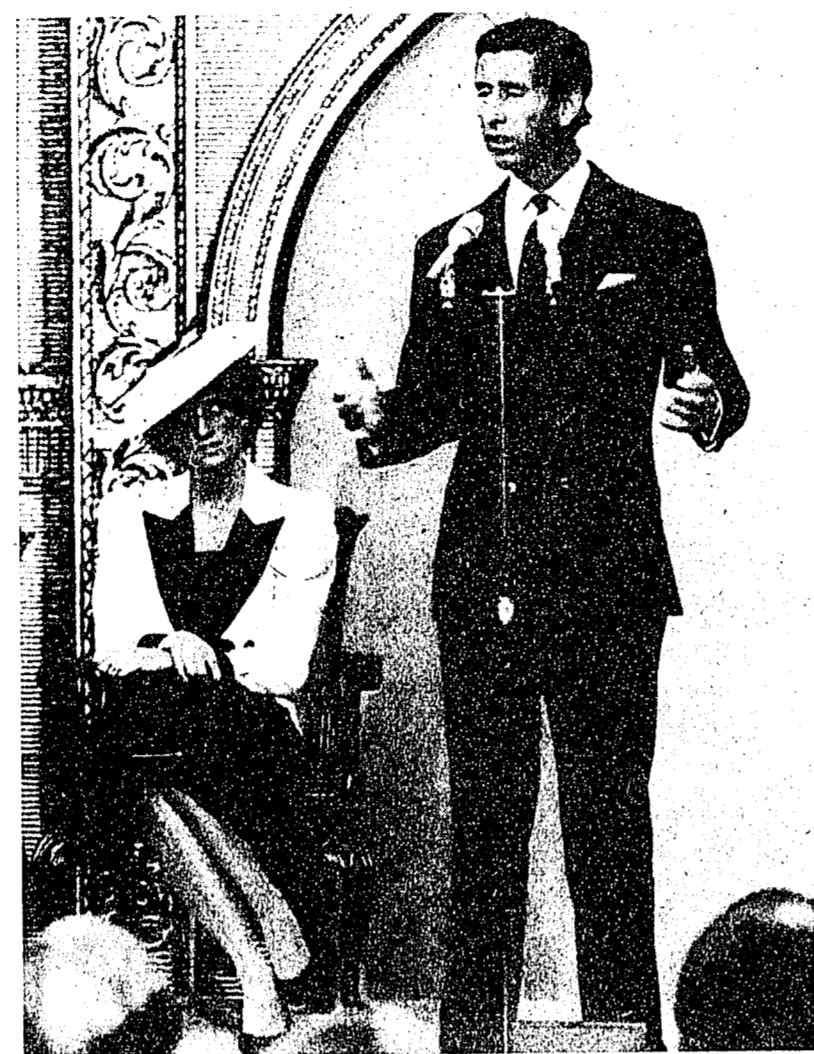
WASHINGTON, D.C. — The Soviet Union objected to virtually every item in a U.S. proposal for a joint communique at the summit between President Reagan and Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev, a senior administration official said yesterday.

Paul H. Nitze, Reagan's chief arms control adviser, said the Soviet rejection, which came in meetings Sunday, was "a major setback."
