

Booters' bench key element

They may not always be visible, but they are always there. As part of the team they see limited playing time, but without them a team could crumble in the event of an injured player. They are the substitute players, or sometimes jokingly referred to as the "bench-warmers," but they play a crucial role on any team. If it weren't for these "bench-warmers," the team's success would not be competing in second-round competition of the National Collegiate Athletic Association playoffs against Temple on Saturday at Jeffrey Field.

These 15 substitute players have combined to score more than 30 percent of the team's goals; five of those 15 goals, game-winners. Senior midfielder Dave Dabora has played in all 20 games, scoring seven goals and four assists, ranking him fourth on the team's scoring list. Senior forward Jay Ruby has played in 16 games and appears in six place with four goals and two assists.

And neither Dabora nor Ruby is a starter. But then, neither are midfielders Torben Aagesen, Jim Bernholz, Chris DePepe, Kai Sarkozy, Gregg Prizzi, Tim Weiss, defenders Simon Eccles, Rich Schmidt, Antzi Allen, forward Ken Simonic or goalies John Pascarella and Dave Arata. But the hardest thing about being a "bench-warmer," the team's success would not be competing in second-round competition of the National Collegiate Athletic Association playoffs against Temple on Saturday at Jeffrey Field.

"To have good substitutes that work hard in practice

goes a long way towards the success of your starters," Bahr said. "Our starters have said that their toughest competition has been in practice. They work harder in practice against our reserve players than they have to work against in some of the games we've played. And that's a tribute to the substitutes."

But a substitute usually doesn't see the consistency a starter does. He may get to play for a substantial period of time, or he may only see a few passing minutes or, he may not be put in the game at all. Nevertheless, these players are faced with not only the physical and mental challenges, but also an extra added pressure of not knowing when or if they will be put in. Assistant Coach Marco Bulatovic said the major difference between starters and non-starters lies in the mental adjustments to a game situation.

"When you start every game, you kind of get in the situation where it doesn't demand as much pressure on you mentally, I would think," Bulatovic said. "Personally, going out knowing you're starting every game, you're more relaxed about it. You're not starting to get your mind set. A substitute player has to think of a few things; you're going to come in, what he's going to do, what time in the game he's going to come in. The main thing is the mental adjustment and having to come into that situation."

Dabora agrees that the most prominent challenge of being a substitute is within the mental boundaries.

"The hardest thing about being a substitute is that you, when I come in I planned on being a starter my whole time," Dabora said, "and the hardest thing is just realizing that the role you're playing is just as important as well, even though you're not starting."

Bahr said the majority of his players were stars on their high school teams and in some instances, they exceeded the high school boundaries.

Jaworski says he'll be ready . . .

PHILADELPHIA — Quarterback Ron Jaworski said yesterday that he will play when the Philadelphia Eagles meet the Dallas Cowboys on Sunday, but his coach and trainer weren't as optimistic. Jaworski, the fourth-ranked passer in the National Football League's National Conference, suffered a bruised shoulder when he was sacked early into the third quarter of the Eagles' 24-14 victory over St. Louis on Sunday.

Eagles Coach Marion Campbell said he thinks Jaworski will play, but trainer Otto Davis, who is treating the quarterback's shoulder injury, gave Jaworski only a 50-50 chance of facing the Cowboys. Jaworski said X-rays of the shoulder were taken again "to be double-safe. I looked at the X-rays with the doctor and he said all he saw was an old shoulder injury."

"It felt a little better today (Wednesday), but Jaworski wouldn't let me do anything to test it. I threw a couple of five-yarders and it was OK. It still was a little sore."

Jaworski said he hoped to throw harder today, but Davis insisted that the quarterback would not practice. "We're going day to day," Davis said. "He won't work tomorrow."

Jaworski said he had full range of motion except for a little knot in the shoulder. "If it was broken, of course I couldn't play. But if it's just sore, I can play," he said. "The doctor told me I wanted to, I could play through soreness."

Campbell said, "Ron expects to play. I think he will play. I'd go up to 20 minutes before kickoff before making a decision."

Jaworski has led the Eagles to five victories in their last six games, and their 1-5 record gives them a chance for a playoff spot in the NFC Eastern Division.

If Jaworski can't play against Dallas, the Eagles would go with rookie Randall Cunningham, who replaced him Sunday with the score 14-14 and led the team to two scoring drives.

The Eagles yesterday signed quarterback Jeff Christiansen as a third-string quarterback in case Jaworski was unable to play and Cunningham got hurt.
