

Potvin breaks Orr's goals mark

UNIONDALE, N.Y. (AP) — Denis Potvin set the NHL record for career goals by a defenseman and rookie Mikko Makiela scored two goals and assisted on three others, including Potvin's historic tally, as the New York Islanders routed Toronto 9-2 last night.

Brent Sutter scored twice and added two assists and his brother Duane had a goal and four assists as the Islanders extended their unbeaten streak to four games, while handing the Maple Leafs their sixth straight loss. Bryan Trottier added a pair of goals for New York, giving him 27 this season.

Makiela's first assist of the night helped set up Potvin's 27st career goal in the second period as the Islanders' captain broke Bobby Orr's career goals mark. Potvin earlier this season had snapped Orr's record of points by a defenseman of 915.

Potvin's goal came on a 40-foot slapshot from the left faceoff circle and gave the Islanders a 2-0 lead. It was his 13th goal this season.

The game was stopped momentarily as Potvin was seen on the puck and received a standing ovation from the Nassau Coliseum crowd.

Orr played parts of 12 seasons with the Boston Bruins and Chicago Black Hawks; Potvin is in his 13th season.

Brent Sutter's score from the slot at 10:32 had given New York a 1-0 edge after the first period.

Bob Bourne then made it 3-0 when he connected from inside the left faceoff circle at 10:10 of the middle session before the Maple Leafs mounted a short-lived comeback.

Toronto scored just 24 seconds later when Marian Stastny connected from the slot. Peter Ilnwack's goal at 10:58 trimmed the New York lead to 3-2.

Flyers 2, Penguins 2

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Dave Poulin scored early in the third period to give the Philadelphia Flyers a 2-2 tie with the Pittsburgh Penguins in NHL action last night.

Poulin scored his 19th goal of the season at 2:31 when he took the puck behind the net, came around the left side of Roberto Romano.

The Flyers continued their dominance of Pittsburgh even though their seven-game winning streak against the Penguins ended. Pittsburgh's last victory over the Flyers came on Dec. 21, 1984.

Knicks defeat Chicago, 118-111

NEW YORK (AP) — Patrick Ewing celebrated his selection as an All-Star with a career-high 37 points, and fellow New York rookies Gerald Wilkins and Bob Thornton also posted their NBA bests as the Knicks defeated the Chicago Bulls 118-111 last night.

Who lost for the seventh time in their last eight games.

Hawks 153, Pacers 92

ATLANTA (AP) — Dominique Wilkins scored 22 points and Kevin Willis added 20 and a game-high 10 rebounds to power the Atlanta Hawks to a 123-92 NBA victory over the Indiana Pacers last night.

The victory was the Hawks' 11th in 14 games. Indiana, dropping its 19th in 21 games on the road, fell to 12-32, the worst mark in the NBA.

Atlanta led 58-48 at halftime and broke the contest open in the third period behind the scoring of Eddie Johnson and Wilkins to go ahead 93-77 entering the final period. Johnson had 11 of his 15 points in the quarter and Wilkins added nine.

Ewing, named by Eastern Conference coaches as a backup center for the Feb. 9 All-Star Game in Dallas, also grabbed 16 rebounds, while Wilkins had 24 points and Thornton 12, both one more than their career highs.

Rockets 116, Cavs 109

HOUSTON (AP) — Allen Leavell scored nine of his 13 points in the pivotal fourth quarter to spark the Houston Rockets to a 116-109 victory last night over the Cleveland Cavaliers in the NBA.

NCAA allows 'Nova to hire player's atty.

HOLIDAYSBURG (AP) — The NCAA has given tentative permission to Villanova University to provide an attorney for freshman basketball player Doug West, who is being sued here by a University of Pittsburgh trustee.

Joseph Haller filed the lawsuit Jan. 2 in Blair County Court after the Lexington (Ky.) Herald-Leader reported that West had accused the Holidayburg oral surgeon of offering him \$10,000 to attend Pitt.

The newspaper printed the allegations last fall in a lengthy series on college basketball recruiting.

Haller's attorney, Merle Evey, said he has not received a response from West. Evey said a deposition is needed from West to determine what type of legal relier Haller will seek.

"(Haller) feels he has a good name in this community and somebody has tried to slander or libel it," Evey said.

Villanova spokesman Craig Miller said a deposition provided by the West family was reviewed Monday by the university and was mailed to the NCAA. The NCAA has withheld formal approval of Villanova's involvement in the case until it reviews the deposition.

Rick Eward, director of the National Collegiate Athletic Association's legal services, said this is the first case of a student-athlete from one school being sued by a booster from another.

Ryan may be named Eagles' coach today

PHILADELPHIA — The Philadelphia Eagles have called a news conference for noon today and are expected to introduce Chicago Bears defensive coordinator Buddy Ryan as their new head coach.

Ryan, whose defense highlighted the Bears' 44-10 victory over the New England Patriots in the Super Bowl on Sunday, was in Philadelphia yesterday to meet with Eagles general manager Harry Gamble.

Ryan, an assistant in the NFL for 18 years with the New York Jets, Minnesota and the Bears, succeeds Marion Campbell, who was fired by owner Norman Braman Dec. 16 before the final game of the season.

The news conference announcement came on the same day the New Orleans Saints announced they had hired one of the Eagles' top candidates, Jim Mora, formerly coach of the Baltimore Stars of the United States Football League.

Sources had reported that Mora and Braman reached an oral agreement Jan. 16. But, according to the sources, Mora then hesitated because of discussions with the Saints and the St. Louis Cardinals, and Braman later balked while reconsidering his original choice, 26-year-old David

Shula, an assistant coach under his father, Don, with the Miami Dolphins.

Braman had broadened his hunt when Shula refused to accept a five-year option on a five-year contract.

Ryan, who will be 52 on Feb. 17, has been with the Bears for eight years as defensive coordinator. In that time, Chicago has ranked in the NFL's top 10 defensively six times.

In the 1985 season, the Bear defenders ranked first against the rush, third against the pass and first overall.

After the 45-10 victory, the most lopsided in Super Bowl history, the Bears circled Ryan off the field. As rumors circulated that Ryan could get head coaching offers, Chicago linebacker Mike Singletary said a top job would be a good opportunity for Ryan.

"But at the same time I don't want him to go because I'm afraid it would spoil the chemistry we have going here," he said. "I guess that sounds selfish, but that's how I feel."

"What Buddy Ryan's done with the defense, and his use of personnel, has been outstanding," Bears Head Coach Mike Ditka said.

Before his eight years with the Bears, Ryan coached eight years with the New York Jets and two years with the Minnesota Vikings.
