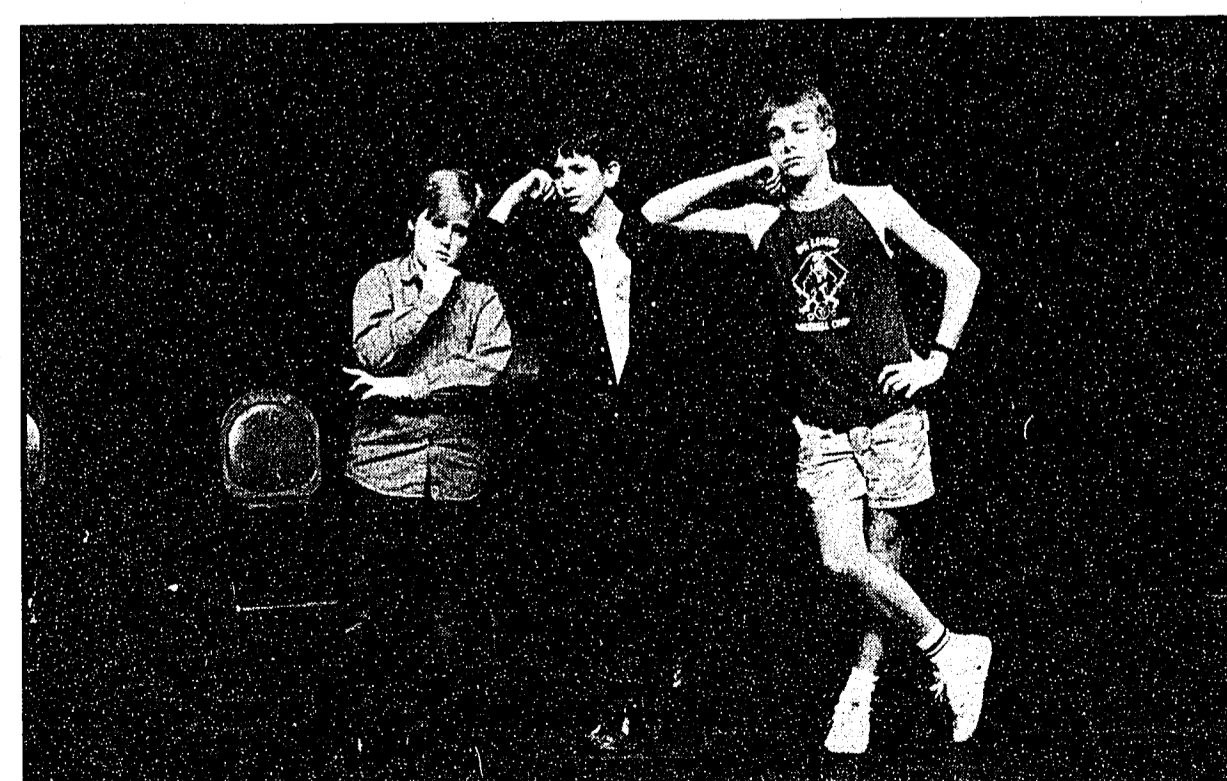

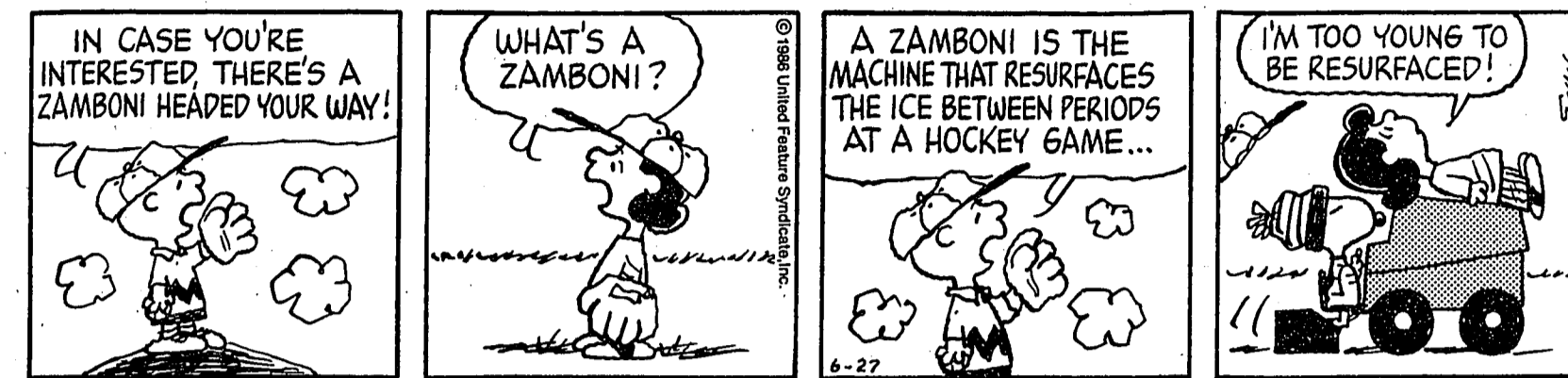

Watercolor Invitational, displayed in the Art Alley, includes works by artists from Maryland, New York and Pennsylvania. Roger Zeller's

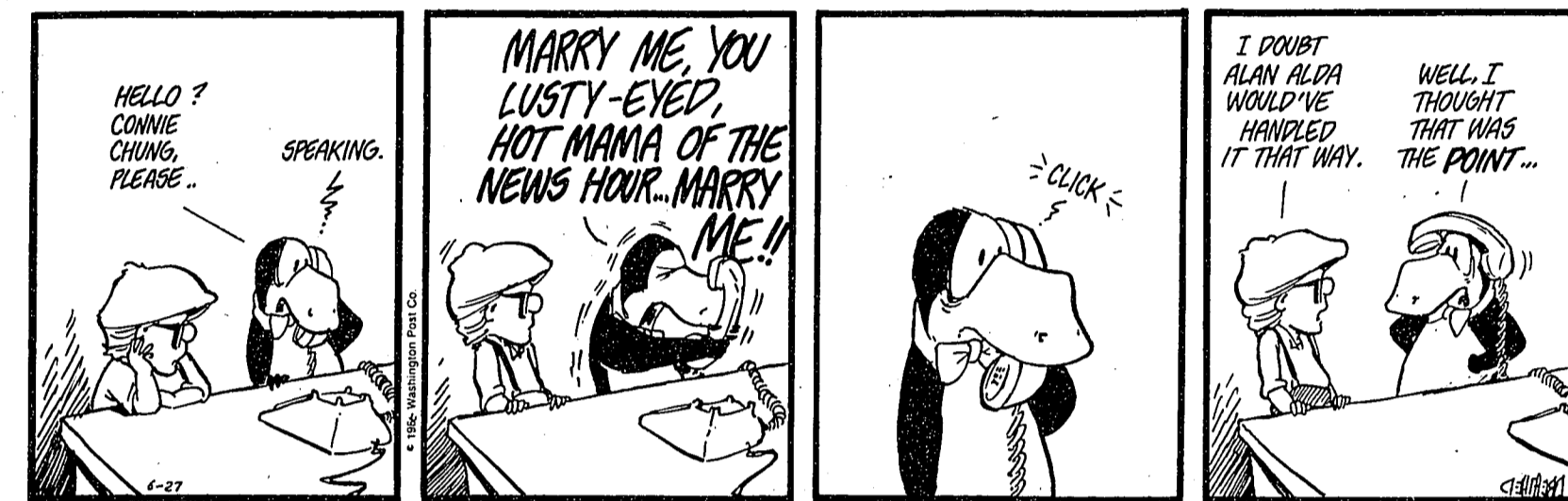

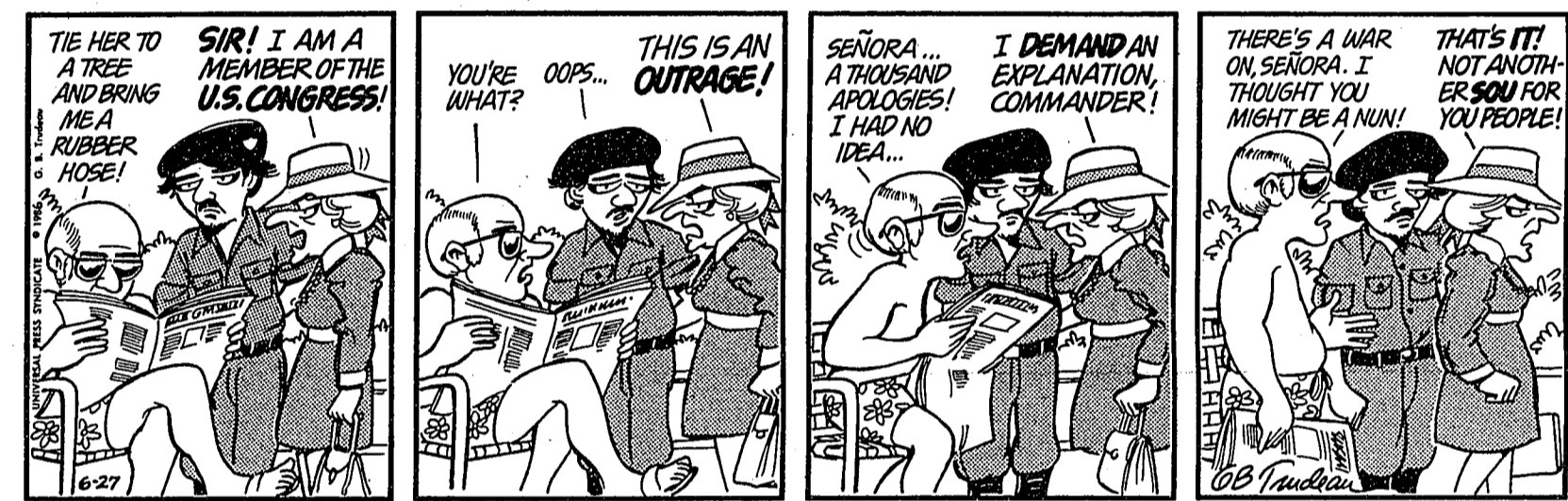

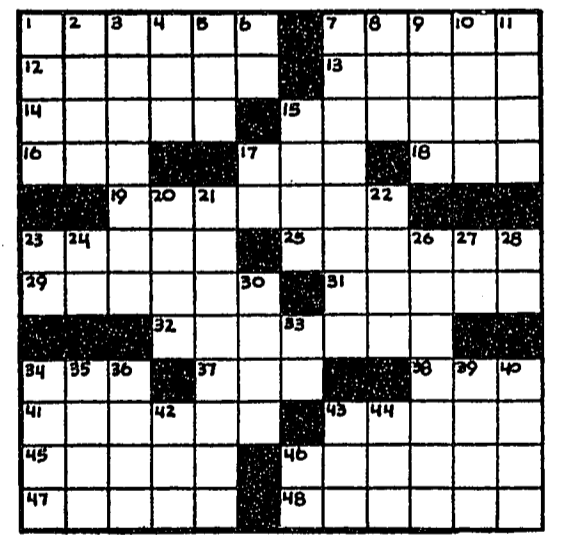
