

Jackson running out of time with Eagles

PHILADELPHIA — Earnest Jackson has gained more than 1,000 yards in each of the last two seasons with the Philadelphia Eagles, but new Coach Buddy Ryan doesn't like his style.

Ryan has all but said that Jackson, a starter tomorrow night against the New York Jets in the final NFL pre-season game for both teams, is gone from the team — by trade or release.

Asked why he didn't seem to be able to find a place for a 1,000-yard runner, Ryan said bluntly: "Yeah, it means he's running the ball 1,000 times."

Ryan said he has a fullback to get him short yardage. He said a halfback has to be able to break long runs.

"Look, there isn't anything wrong with him," Ryan said of Jackson, who averages 4 yards per carry. "We just like different style runners and blockers."

Recently, he said of Jackson: "He can't do three things — run, catch passes or block."

Jackson, 27, knows where he stands.

"I'm fed up with it," said the 208-pound runner. "I don't know what to do. I don't want to walk out. I lose a lot. I guess the best thing is to be traded if they don't want me."

Jackson isn't interested in making the team and sitting on the bench.

"For me to sit on the bench and still get a big salary... I don't need that. I don't want to be getting \$375,000 a year, sit on the bench and after the season have people ask, 'who's Earnest?'"

Jackson admits he would rather stay with the Eagles.

"But they have to stop playing with my head," he said.

Ron Jaworski starts at quarterback for the Eagles, but Matt Cavanaugh and Randall Cunningham both will see action as the clubs seek to even their exhibition record at 2-2.

Ryan also hopes to get a better line on the competition for starting jobs at wide receiver between Phil Smith and Kenny Jackson, at center where Gerry Feehery and Matt Darwin are candidates, and running back involving six contenders. Punter Mike Horan could kick himself in or out of a job.

Coach Joe Walton of the Jets, also 1-2, says he plans to play his first

team at least half of the game.

"I still have a few questions to resolve and will run in some rookies and free agents" late in the game," Walton said. "But this last pre-season game is used to solidify for the opener. It's time to get ready."

Walton plans a lot of action for veterans he has used sparingly — running back Freeman McNeill, corner Russell Carter, defensive tackle Joe Klecko and defensive end Mark Gastineau. Also, Ken O'Brien, who has been dividing the quarterback job with Pat Ryan, may play into the third quarter.

NFL exhibition roundup

This week's subject for Buddy Ryan is Mark Gastineau.

"He's just a pass rusher," said Ryan, who has spent his first six months as head coach of the Philadelphia Eagles debanking nearly everyone in sight — ranging from his ex-boss, Chicago Bears Coach Mike Ditka, to the usually sacrosanct Don Shula, the target last week when the Eagles lost to Shula's Miami Dolphins.

So it's only natural that Gastineau is the subject for this week — the Eagles entertain the New York Jets and their All-Pro defensive end tonight at Veteran's Stadium. The Ryan's gripe is that Reggie White, his

second-year defensive lineman, is better than Gastineau.

"He's probably the best defensive lineman I've been around and I've been around a lot of good ones," Ryan said. "He's a real football player. Gastineau's just a pass rusher."

Retorts Gastineau, himself rarely at a loss for words: "If I wasn't with a classy organization like the Jets, I'd say now that Buddy Ryan is separated from Mike Ditka, he'll never win a game. It would be Buddy Who? I feel sorry for someone like that."

There is one other game tonight as the NFL's last exhibition weekend begins — the Cleveland Browns meet the Raiders at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

There are six more games tomorrow night — Tampa Bay at Miami, Atlanta at Washington, Detroit at Cincinnati, the Los Angeles Rams at Denver, Seattle at San Francisco, and St. Louis at San Diego.

Saturday's games are Chicago vs. Buffalo at Notre Dame Stadium in South Bend, Ind., Pittsburgh at the New York Giants, New England at Green Bay, Kansas City at New Orleans, Minnesota at Indianapolis, and Houston at Dallas.

The Jets and Eagles each enter their game 1-2, a circumstance that hasn't sat well with Ryan.

One of his targets is Earnest Jackson, a 1,000-yard rusher in each of the past two

seasons, who will start tonight but may be gone when the season starts.

"He can't do three things — run, catch passes or block," Ryan said.

Ron Jaworski starts at quarterback for the Eagles, but Matt Cavanaugh and Randall Cunningham also will see action. Coach Joe Walton of the Jets said he plans to play his first team at least half of the game.

The Browns are approaching their game with the Raiders the same way. They view

their opponent as similar to the Super Bowl champion Bears, against whom they open the season the following week.

"The personalities of the Raiders and Bears are similar," Coach Marty Schottenheimer said. "They're rough, aggressive, brawling-type teams."

The teams, who meet again Nov. 16, will go with their starting quarterbacks for at least a half. Bernie Kosar will open for the Browns and Marc Wilson for the Raiders.

Napoleon McCallum, who seems assured of a roster spot with the Raiders even though he's an ensign in the Navy and has a five-year service obligation, is expected to see extensive action against the Browns.
