

## Stickwomen gang up on Ursinus

The field hockey team (12-3-2) scored early and often yesterday afternoon as it white-washed Ursinus 5-1 in a game which saw many of the Lady Lions get into the act.

Six different players on the Penn State squad tallied points, a fact that impressed Head Coach Gillian Rattray.

"All of our goals were sort of a team effort," Rattray said. "There was usually two people or three people involved before (the ball) made it to the goal."

And it didn't take the Lady Lions long to get the ball to the goal. Sophomore forward Lisa Bervinchak got Penn State on the board quickly when she redirected sophomore forward Tracey Neave's shot past Bears' netminder Mia Fields at the 3:56 mark of the first half. The tally was Bervinchak's eighth of the season, and Neave was credited with her fourth assist.

For Neave, the afternoon wound up being just another day at the office. After senior midfielder Chris Vitale and Ursinus forward Ginny Migliore traded goals at the 7:43 and 26:48 by only one goal (2-1) despite the fact that it was dominating the game and controlling the ball.

But then Neave got on track and put the game out of reach. The Glenolden native gave Penn State a 3-1 halftime cushion at the 30:20 mark when she out-fought an Ursinus defender for the ball 20 yards to the left of the Bears' cage, rifled a shot across the crease, and watched as the ball ricocheted off of Fields' leg into the goal.

Fields entered the game with a solid 1.0 goals against average, but as the game progressed, it was obvious that the relentless Lady Lion attack was beginning to take its toll. Rattray said Penn State's two quick goals at the game's outset might have rattled Fields a little bit.

"We got to her early," she said. "She's the sort of girl that the longer you don't get to her, the more confident she feels. She plays better, and better, and better. The two quick goals really hurt her."

The player who closed the first-half scoring would open it in the second-half.

Five minutes and 53 seconds into the second stanza, Neave, who was moving toward the Ursinus goal, redirected senior midfielder Mary Mc-

Carthy's shot past Fields. The goal was the 28th of her career, and it scored five goals in a game or won by more than three goals.

"I think it was great that we opened up the scoring a little bit today because we're going to need to open up our scoring more," Geller said.

"We've been winning by one or two goals. I think this is great for us to win by four goals. It's going to help our confidence in the next four games."

The loss drops Ursinus' record to 7-6.

# Mets fall prey to Hurst, poor fielding in 4-2 loss

BOSTON — Bruce Hurst extended his mastery of the Mets, and the Boston Red Sox took advantage of some New York miseries in the field to move within one victory of their first World Series title in 68 years, beating the Mets 4-2 last night.

The victory enabled the Red Sox to avert a sweep by the Mets of the three games in Boston and gave them a 3-2 lead in the best-of-seven Series.

Hurst, who pitched eight scoreless innings to win the first game 1-0, shut down the Mets this time on 10 hits, when Tim Lincecum homered and in the ninth when Rafael Santana had an RBI single.

Hurst turned back another New York threat in the fifth inning with the help of a key strikeout of Lenny Dykstra, a hero in Games 3 and 4 and whom the Red Sox accused of botching.

"The Mets' only error" of the game, by shortstop Santana, led to one run. Dykstra and Darryl Strawberry collaborated on a misplay that led to another run, and, when things went wrong for the Mets, even the wind played a part in Boston scoring.

Dave Henderson had a double and

triple for Boston, drove in a run and scored once.

Pitching on three days' rest, Mets ace Dwight Gooden turned to his offspeed stuff, but his fielders were so off, it didn't help much. He pitched into the fifth inning and left with none out and two runs home as the Red Sox took a 4-0 lead. In two World Series losses, Gooden has an ERA of 8.00. He also was the loser of Game Two.

Hurst, who allowed only four hits in the first game, was working on his regular four days' rest because of a gamble that Red Sox Manager John McNamara made in Game 4, using Al Nipper to start.

The Series now goes to Game 6 tomorrow night in New York with Boston's 24-game winner Roger Clemens, working on five days' rest. Mets left-hander Bob Ojeda, winner of Game 3, will be pitching with three days off.

Hurst struck out six and walked one. Gooden had two walks and three strikeouts in an outing that continued a trend of lack of support by his teammates. Gooden has been the beneficiary of just three runs in 26 postseason innings. But this time, his defense also betrayed him.

The Red Sox scored their first run in the second inning, provided by the Seattle connection of former Mari-

ners Henderson and Spike Owen and giving the home team its first lead in this Series.

With one out, Henderson sent a low line drive into the gap in right-center. Mets right fielder Darryl Strawberry and center fielder Dykstra converged on the ball, but it skipped under Strawberry's glove, and Dykstra fell down on the wet warning track as he took the ball off the wall. Henderson raced all the way to third with a triple.

Although there was no error called on the play, Henderson clearly could have been held to a double by Strawberry, probably also by Dykstra.

Owen, the next batter, hit a fly ball to medium-depth left field, where Mookie Wilson caught it for the out. Tagging up at third, Henderson beat Wilson's throw home easily, and the Red Sox led 1-0.

Shortstop Santana's error gave the Red Sox another run in the third. With one out, gimpy-legged Bill Buckner hit a soft ground ball to Santana. The ball came up on the Mets shortstop and kicked into the air as Buckner hobbled to first. Gooden walked the next hitter, Jim Rice, then struck out Don Baylor on an 0-2 curveball.


Gooden got one strike on Evans before he connected on a fastball, sending it into center field for a

single. Buckner, troubled by both ankle and knee injuries, was barely past third base when Dykstra fielded the ball, and a good throw might have been in time. Instead, Dykstra's throw was high and to the first-base side of home plate as Buckner slid in head first with what must have been the most painful run of the World Series. It hurt the Mets too though as Boston led 2-0.

In the fifth inning, the Red Sox added two more runs, one that most likely would not have scored without the 15 mph wind blowing from left field to right. Rice hit a long fly ball toward the deepest part of the park in center field with Dykstra in pursuit. But the wind took hold of the ball, changing its flight path, and it hit the 5-foot-high wall in right-center for a triple.

Baylor, 1-for-8 at that point and without an RBI, hit a blooming single into right field off his fists, scoring Rice without a throw.

Evans followed with a ground single through a hole in the left side created by a hit-and-run as Baylor advanced to third. That was the end for 17-game winner Gooden, who had allowed just two runs in 17 playoff innings and was shelled for eight runs in nine innings in the Series.


