Radio station to raise funds

To "help put the public back in public radio," WPSU-FM, the University's student-run public radio station, has begun efforts to raise \$15,000 in its annual fund drive.

The drive started Monday and will end Nov. 16. WPSU Business Manager Jeff Daley said the station receives most of its funding from the Student Organizations Budget Committee, which covers operational costs such as postage, telephone costs and some equipment purchases, but this funding is not enough to cover the full cost of running the station.

It costs \$50,000 a year to run the station, Daley said. Additional costs include the station's subscription to National Public Radio, which provides the station with the news programs *Morning Edition* and *All Things Considered*, Daley said.

About \$8,000 is usually raised each year, Daley said. This year's goal is higher, Daley said, because the amount raised in previous years would only be enough to pay for the station's NPR subscription and would not allow the station to expand its programming or update its equipment.

Some of the programs WPSU offers include live broadcasts of the Metropolitan Opera and the Chicago, New York and Philadelphia symphony orchestras.

Jim O'Brien, WPSU student station manager, said the expansion of programming includes buying additional records and compact discs for music programs. He said it also provides the opportunity to purchase more programs from NPR or similar services that might become available if there were a demand for them here. "WPSU is a student-run public radio," Daley said. "It is important for a number of reasons. First, it provides alternative music and programs not currently available in this market. Second, it provides students and residents with an opportunity to gain experience in radio."

Rash of fires raises suspicion

State College police said two fires that caused heavy damage early yesterday morning were "suspicious in nature."

The front of a home at 505 S. Pugh St. was damaged in a fire at about 5 a.m. yesterday, State College Bureau of Police Services said. A member of the Interfraternity Council Crime Watch heard glass breaking at the house, then saw a couch on the porch and the window frames on the front of the house engulfed in flames.

The fire was the fourth in State College and the surrounding area since last week. The other fires were a house fire at 318 Locust Lane, a garage fire at the corner of Locust Lane and Prospect Avenue, and a house fire at 228 E. Fairmount Ave. Another fire yesterday morning at about 1 a.m. destroyed the garage at the home of Maurice Philippet, 119 Rainio St., College Township, police said.

Philippet told police he had been watching television in his home at the time of the blaze. He heard a noise, then noticed the northwest side of his garage on fire, police said.

Two vehicles, a 1986 Dodge pickup truck and an Audi, were destroyed in the fire, police said.

Alpha Fire Company Chief Marvin Robinson said no cause has been established for the fires. An investigation is continuing.
