After clinching the 118-pound championship for the last two years, Martin will move up a weight and wrestle at 126 while Mayo will defend his title at 177.

Ranked third in the Amatuer Wrestling News preseason poll, Penn State boasts five wrestlers in the Top Ten. Ken Chertow and Mayo are showcased as the two top wrestlers in the country at 126 and 177, respectively. Martin and Sean Finkbeiner are fifth at 134 and 150 and Andy Voit is fourth at 190.

The '86 Mat Town Tournament was a tribute to some of the nation's best talent. Virtually every weight class was top-heavy with big names. This year will be a bit different for the Lions, however.

Because much of the squad is relatively young, the team is unproven in about five weight classes. But Lorenzo feels that with the talent he's seen in the practice room, the team should fare well. And with no Hawkeyes or defending tournament champions. Iowa State Cyclones, last year's

this year's 12-team tourney should be more evenly matched.

"We don't have an Iowa State in there this year, but Edinboro has a nice balance and Army has a tough team," Lorenzo said. "We're expecting a lot of good competition. This year should be more evenly balanced because there won't be the same calibre national champions.

"It's a great opportunity for 20 of our young men to get experience, not just the starters.
