LAS VEGAS - Rodney Dangerfield was awarded \$725,000 yesterday by a jury that believed the comedian's eye problems were caused by a steam bath accident at Caesars Palace.

Dangerfield sued the casino-hotel for \$5 million after Caesars balked at paying him for shows he missed after he claimed he was burned in a steam bath in March 1988.

"We showed Rodney some respect," an unidentified juror said after Dangerfield thanked jurors as they left U.S. District Court.
