**Two men to face rape charges in Dec. trials**

Two men were bound over for December trials on sexual assault charges in the Centre County Court-house Wednesday.

Vincent Strausser, of Philadelphia, will face charges of rape and indecent assault for an alleged incident Sept. 20 at 924 Bellaire Ave., said a spokeswoman from the District Attorney's office.

Strausser is accused of raping a 19-year-old female student from the University's Ogontz campus while she was unconscious at a local party.

Several people walked into the bedroom during the alleged attack and identified Strausser, according to police reports.

Donald Lee Moser, 36, 1245 S. Atherton St., faces charges of attempted rape and indecent assault for an alleged incident on Sept. 16 in Miles Township, the spokeswoman said. The alleged attempted rape occurred on Madisonburg Mountain Road while he was giving the 20-year-old victim a ride home from Carl's Bad Tavern in Spring Township.

The woman told police she was unconscious, but awoke when she felt Moser touching her, according to police records. She resisted the alleged attack by promising to have intercourse with Moser after returning to his apartment. Upon arriving there, she called her boyfriend for help, according to police records.

**Comedian gets, some respect in suit against casino**

LAS VEGAS — Rodney Dangerfield was awarded \$725,000 yesterday by a jury that believed the comedian's eye problems were caused by a steam bath accident at Caesars Palace.

Dangerfield sued the casino-hotel for \$5 million after Caesars balked at paying him for shows he missed after he claimed he was burned in a steam bath in March 1988.

"We showed Rodney some respect," an unidentified juror said after Dangerfield thanked jurors as they left U.S. District Court.

The jury deliberated less than a day before awarding Dangerfield \$225,000 for five missed performances

and \$500,000 for pain and suffering.

The jury ruled that Dangerfield's contract obligated Caesars to pay for the missed shows because the injury should have excused him from performing. It rejected a \$100,000 countersuit filed by Caesars against its former headliner.

"The truth won out," said Dangerfield. He decried as "nonsense and untrue" Caesars' accusations that he used drugs.

"I'm surprised they went to that level to degrade me falsely like they did," Dangerfield said. "All they did in this entire trial was to try to degrade my character."

"I wasn't concerned with the amount of money," he said. "Money is money. I was concerned about the truth. I was right. I wouldn't have gone through this unless I was right."

Dangerfield said Henry Gluck, chairman of the resort's parent Caesars World Inc., had refused an offer to settle for \$225,000.

"We're very disappointed," said Bruce Aguilera, attorney for the casino. "We'll have to have our lawyers look at the case."

Dangerfield sought \$5 million in damages plus \$45,000 for each show he missed the week of the accident.

The hotel, in its countersuit, accused Dangerfield of breaching his contract and contended during the 2½-week-long trial that the comedian did not suffer permanent damage.

The 68-year-old comic testified he was hit in the eyes by a burst of steam as he opened the door to the steam room on March 16, 1988.

**Children escape blaze, parents die**

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) — A rooming house blaze killed a man and a woman as they struggled to save their nine sleeping children early yesterday, fire officials said. The children escaped.

The fire broke out about 12:30 a.m. and destroyed the two-story wooden house before firefighters could respond, said Deputy Fire Chief Ed Spann.

Several of the children were treated for minor injuries, but the only fatalities were the two adults, said Spann.

Details of how the children escaped were not immediately available.
