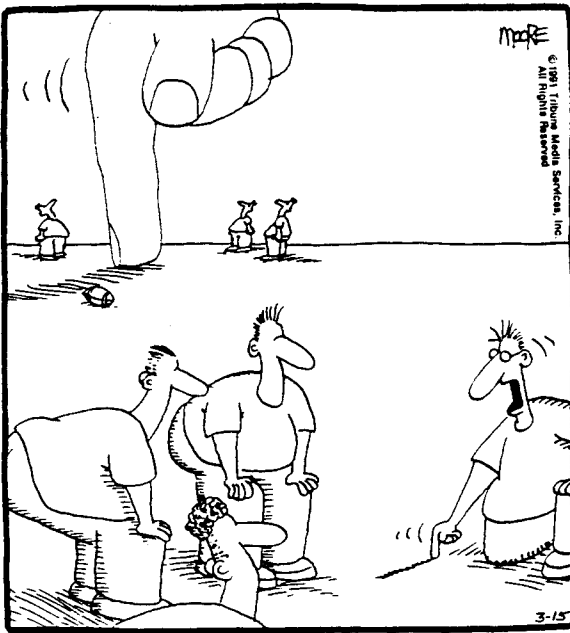

# Netmen pound Pittsburgh, 9-0

The men's tennis team bounced back after its loss to Penn on Tuesday by shutting down the University of Pittsburgh, 9-0, yesterday at the Indoor Tennis Complex.

"As a team we played consistent, tough tennis," No. 4 singles player Corey Goldstein said. "We all worked real hard and were on top of our game."

The six singles matches were played first and the Lions swept each match without difficulties. Sophomore Mark Price easily put away Pitt's No. 1 Eric Weaver, 6-1, 6-1. Senior co-captain Dave Schoenly was matched with Panther No. 2 Larry Garrado, and defeated him, 6-3, 6-4.

The parade continued with senior co-captain Scott Pickering overthrowing No. 3 Jeff Mills, 6-3, 7-5, and Goldstein trouncing John Tegano, 6-2, 6-0.

"I jumped on top right away," Goldstein said. "I don't think he (Tegano) was ever really in it after I started winning."

Freshman Greg Gant, playing at No. 5, clinched the win for the Lions, defeating Terry O'Connor, 6-1, 6-4. Sophomore Sean Snee finished up the singles with a 6-4, 6-3 victory over David Ginder.

"We were favored in the match," Coach Jan Bortner said. "I thought that in most matches we got off to a pretty good start, but then we had the tendency to relax a little. We need to continue to work on that."

Bortner had the chance to juggle his lineup after clinching the match with the singles. The No. 1 doubles stayed the same, with Schoenly and Price picking up a 7-5, 6-0 win over Weaver and Mills.

The No. 2 doubles team was sophomore Mark Payne and freshman Chad Skorupka. Payne and Skorupka played well together, easily defeating Garrado and Joel Orth, 6-1, 6-3.

The third doubles team was sophomore Don Grosser and freshman Kevin Mullen. Grosser and Mullen played a pro-set, defeating Tegano and Ginder 8-4.

"I was happy that we could give all 10 guys a chance to play today," Bortner said.

The Lions will travel to Maryland tomorrow for what Bortner feels will be a tough match.

"This is a tough stretch for us, we play 11 matches in two weeks," Bortner said. "I'm hoping we can dig deep for this one. It's going to be a tough match."
