Despite more women members, sexism in group still exists

Lesbian, Gay and Bisexual Student Alliance members agree that although the climate for women in the group is improving, sexism still

Women in the group must first deal with the fact that there are more men in the group. At an average meeting this semester, there are about 15 women present out of 50 members.

'That's a big improvement," said Catharine Buck, LGBSA political co-director. "It's been really difficult because there's more men in the group."

Men outnumber women in LGBSA because women usually reveal their sexual orientations later than men, Buck said.

"To have someone come out as I did, at 17, is pretty unusual," said Buck (sophomore-English).

Members of the University community tonight will have a chance to learn about vital environmental issues the United Nations will address this June during the Earth Summit.

Universities and other groups from all over the country will participate tonight in a teleconference organized by the Iowa division of the United Nations Association-USA, the National Wildlife Federation and the University of Iowa Student Asso-

dent Government and Eco-Action will sponsor the teleconference here from 7:30 to 10 tonight in 312 Keller.

The teleconference will feature panelists who work in various environmental fields and will focus on the upcoming U.N. conference on environment and development - the Earth Summit - to be held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, June 1-12, said Kay Powers, assistant teleconference project director.

The teleconference will be divided into segments dealing with specific environmental topics. A ques-

students across the country," Stewart said.

The teleconference started within the Big Ten but has spread to schools around the country, Stewart said. About 100 sites nationwide and in Mexico and Canada will participate, Powers said.

Along with the teleconference, a letter-writing campaign will be organized asking that President Bush attend the Earth Summit in person because of the importance of environmental issues, Powers said.




