## Court rejects appeal for death row inmate

SMYRNA, Del. (AP) — A federal appellate court yesterday denied the latest appeal for condemned killer Kenneth DeShields, who is scheduled for execution by lethal injection on Aug. 31.

The U.S. Third Circuit Court of Appeals in Philadelphia refused a rehearing for DeShields, who is fighting his death sentence and conviction.

A three-judge panel of the appellate court had refused Aug. 9 to act on the case. Defense attorneys then petitioned to have the full court, consisting of 12 judges, to conduct a hearing on the appeal.

That motion was denied yesterday, a court official in Philadelphia said. The motion has run its full course in the Third Circuit, and the next step would be to present it to the U.S. Supreme Court, she said.

Gary Traynor and Kevin Howard, attorneys for DeShields, did not return telephone calls to The Associated Press yesterday.

DeShields attorneys also have petitioned the state Board of Pardons to recommend to the gover-

nor that his death sentence be commuted to life in prison.

The board has scheduled a hearing for 9:30 a.m. tomorrow at the Delaware Correctional Center.

There was some uncertainty yesterday as to whether the meeting should proceed. Lt. Gov. Ruth Ann Minner, who is president of the panel, decided to go ahead after the Third Circuit denied DeShields' appeal, said Lee Ann Walling, a spokeswoman for the lieutenant governor.

"She thinks the rules are pretty clear, even in an extraordinary case like this. All appeals have to be exhausted first," she said.

DeShields is the first condemned killer in recent memory to appeal to the board. After 46 years without an execution, Delaware executed two men last year, but both men had given up their right to appeal.

"They wanted to go," said Attorney General Charles Oberly. "This is the first person who has come this close, and it is involuntary, and he had every right to appeal for clemency."
