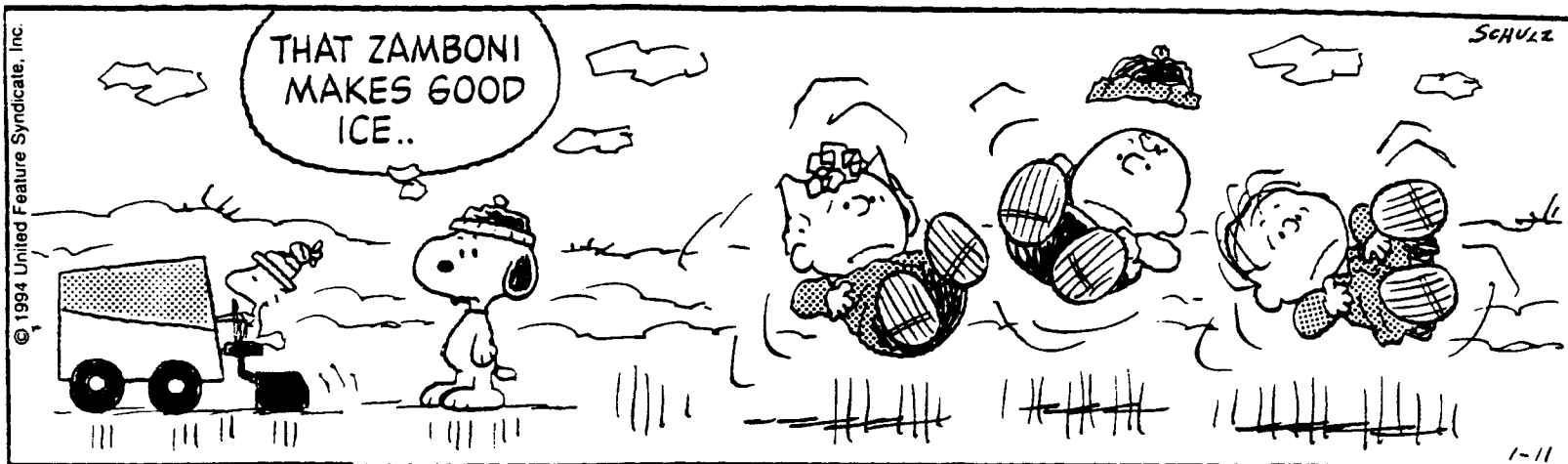
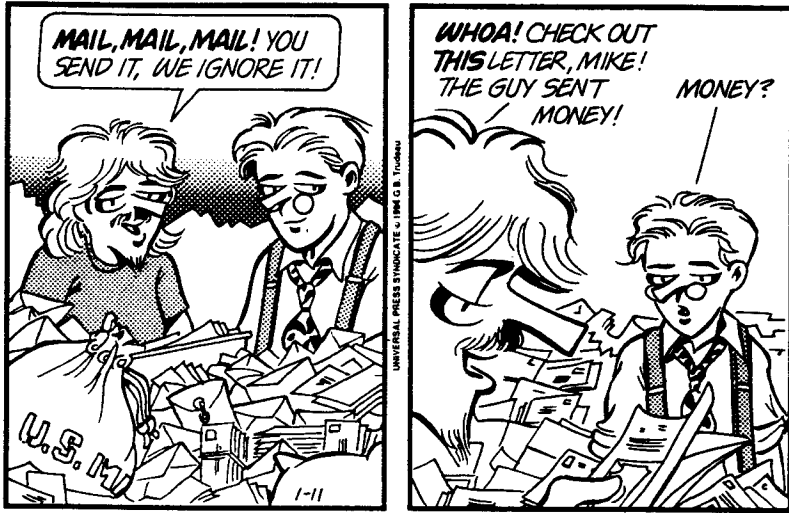

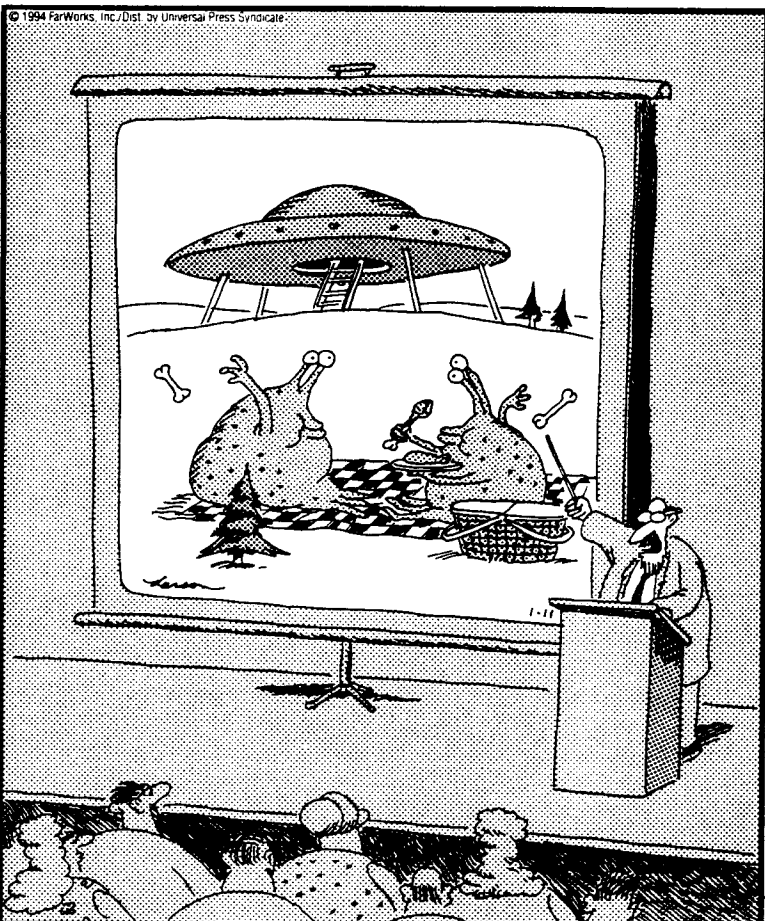

Required Text: Damon, Thomas D. *Introduction to Space: The Science of Spaceflight*, Orbit Book Co., 1989.

This course is a study of the development and implementation of spaceflight and space exploration. It includes an introduction to propulsion, orbital and ground telescopes and the electromagnetic spectrum, problems associated with living and working in space, operation of the National Space Transportation System (Space Shuttle), biological and materials research in microgravity environments, orbits, remote sensing, the space environment, and life in the universe. Very broadly interdisciplinary, the course covers many different fields of science in understandable ways through the study of topics that influence much of our daily life. Only simple algebra and geometry are required. The class will be lecture-based with some guest lecturers and some use of audio-visual media. There are two midterm tests, a paper, and a final comprehensive examination.
