

Masked men rob convenience store

Autopsy reveals student sniffed silicone from can

BLOOMSBURG (AP) — Autopsy reports on a 16-year-old Bloomsburg High School student who died in his bed two months ago have confirmed that the young man sniffed a fatal dose of silicone from a spray can.

Darren Klingerman, a sophomore honor student and basketball and track team member, was attempting to get the fuzzy, numb feeling of an anesthetic when he accidentally overdosed, said Columbia County Coroner Ali A. Alley.

The methane, butane, hexane and trichloroethane contained in the spray caused Klingerman's heart to beat irregularly and eventually stop, Alley said.

The youth was found dead in his bed the morning of Oct. 25 when his parents tried to wake him for school. A spray can of machinery lubricant containing silicone was found in his room, Alley said.
