# System fails 2-year-old found beaten to death

PITTSBURGH (AP) - Children who die suddenly after years of trouble are often described as having "fallen through the cracks." The trouble for Shawntee Ford was that her father was able to get through some of those same cracks.

Sent to live with foster parents while her mother sought treatment for drug abuse, Shawntee was later handed over to her father — despite his arrests for punching a girlfriend in the face, holding a girlfriend and his two sons hostage and shooting a gun from a window.

On March 9, just a little over a month after she began living with her father, 2-year-old Shawntee was found dead in her father's Pittsburgh hotel room. He was charged with fatally beating her.

Allegheny County Children and Youth Services failed to report the arrest record of 30-year-old Maurice Booker of Pittsburgh to the judge that granted him cus-

tody, the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette reported Sunday. The judge had ordered the

agency to investigate Booker's background. The problem with the agency's


check on Booker is apparently not isolated.


The same week Shawntee died, the Department of Public Welfare informed the Children and Youth Services agency that it would receive a six-month provisional license because auditors had discovered 72 violations of regulations.

Among the violations was a failure to make timely criminal record checks.

State regulations do not specify what the agency must do when a judge directs it to investigate a father seeking custody.

And the state Department of Public Welfare's Western Regional Office of Children, Youth and Families investigated Shawntee's death and reported Aug. 15 that the agency had acted properly.
