

# McClatchy closes in on purchasing Bucs

RANCHO MURIETTA, Calif.— As a teenager, Kevin McClatchy dreamed of owning a professional sports team. Not that far removed from his teen years, McClatchy is about to buy the Pittsburgh Pirates.

At 32, the scion of a Sacramento newspaper dynasty would become the youngest owner in major league baseball, and possibly in the history of the sport.

"I think I've known since high school that it would be something I would enjoy doing," McClatchy said in an interview last week in this Sacramento suburb. "I didn't always necessarily think it would be realistic."

McClatchy and his partners Tuesday agreed to put up \$50 million in cash, plus a

\$50 million bank line of credit, to buy and operate the team. He posted a nonrefundable \$1 million down payment and the Pirates' board voted unanimously to sell the team.

Details of the \$85 million deal remain to be worked out, and the sale must be approved by major league baseball.

A self-professed "sports fanatic," McClatchy skis and golfs. He also plays first base in a Sacramento summer recreational league. He's just a year older than Pirates' third baseman Jeff King.

Friends and business associates weren't surprised McClatchy succeeded in a few weeks in arranging the deal when others tried for months and failed.

They described him as a capable businessman who works hard and loves an upset.

"Kevin is a pretty focused guy," said Brad

Tisdale, a Santa Barbara insurance salesman who attended college with McClatchy at the University of California-Santa Barbara.

"I just remember Kevin being intense. He would always want to do things perfectly," Tisdale said. "When we were in football practice, and he would make a mistake, he would get really upset and he'd work and work and work until he got it right."

Erwin Potts, chief executive for McClatchy Newspapers Inc. in Sacramento, described McClatchy as bright, capable and determined.

"I hope we haven't lost him forever to the newspaper business," Potts said.

McClatchy became the fifth generation of his family to be involved with The Sacramento Bee after his father died of a heart attack in 1989.

He worked in advertising for the paper.

# Keenan not finding warm welcome in St. Louis

ST. LOUIS— In the process of trying to build a Stanley Cup contender, Mike Keenan has so alienated St. Louis Blues fans that he's afraid they're trying to run him out of town.

When the spotlight fell on the Blues' coach and general manager during pre-game ceremonies for the Blues' 5-3 victory over Edmonton in their home opener Tuesday night, boos rained down. The man with the imperious, chin-high glare who has replaced all but three players on the roster since he arrived in July 1994 was obviously

bothered after the game Tuesday.

He said he never imagined the fallout from all the dealing, capped by the trade of fan favorites Brendan Shanahan and Curtis Joseph this summer.

"I don't know what the fans expect," Keenan said. "I suppose they may have somebody in mind that could do a better job for them. It's very disheartening and very disappointing. I think it's very unfair."

Brett Hull, one of the three holdovers, feels the same way.

"We had some popular players and they're gone now, but I think we have to get a grasp on the fact that they aren't here anymore and

we've got some great players that they can embrace," Hull said. "He's a great leader and we have great players."

"Just give us a chance."

Keenan said he's just doing what he's done in the rest of his NHL stops, and his track record — one Stanley Cup and three other finalists — shows he knows what he's doing. When he was in Chicago, he said Blackhawks fans understood why dealing Denis Savard for Chris Chelios would help the franchise.

"There was a little bit of a reaction when I traded Savard, but not like this," Keenan said. "Not nearly like this."

Keenan blamed the media for his problems. He said he's been unfairly portrayed as a heartless soul with no consideration for tradition or fan attachment, particularly after dealing Shanahan to Hartford in July for young defenseman Chris Pronger.

"They are obviously getting feedback from you people," Keenan said at his post-game news briefing. "I think they base most of their opinion on what's written or said in here."

"There are a lot of value judgments made about hockey players and support of fan favorites."

Hull, Murray Baron and Basil McRae are the only players left.
