## McClatchy closes in on purchasing Bucs

RANCHO MURIETTA, Calif.— As a teenager, Kevin McClatchy dreamed of owning a professional sports team. Not that far removed from his teen years, McClatchy is about to buy the Pittsburgh Pirates.

At 32, the scion of a Sacramento newspaper dynasty would become the youngest owner in major league baseball, and possibly in the history of the sport.

"I think I've known since high school that it would be something I would enjoy doing," McClatchy said in an interview last week in this Sacramento suburb. "I didn't always necessarily think it would be realistic."

### Book describes sports addiction

just doesn't get sports? "The questions are meant to be fun but can sometimes help solve serious problems," Quirk said. He also said a lot of women are calling him asking for copies of the questions to give to their husbands or boyfriends.




