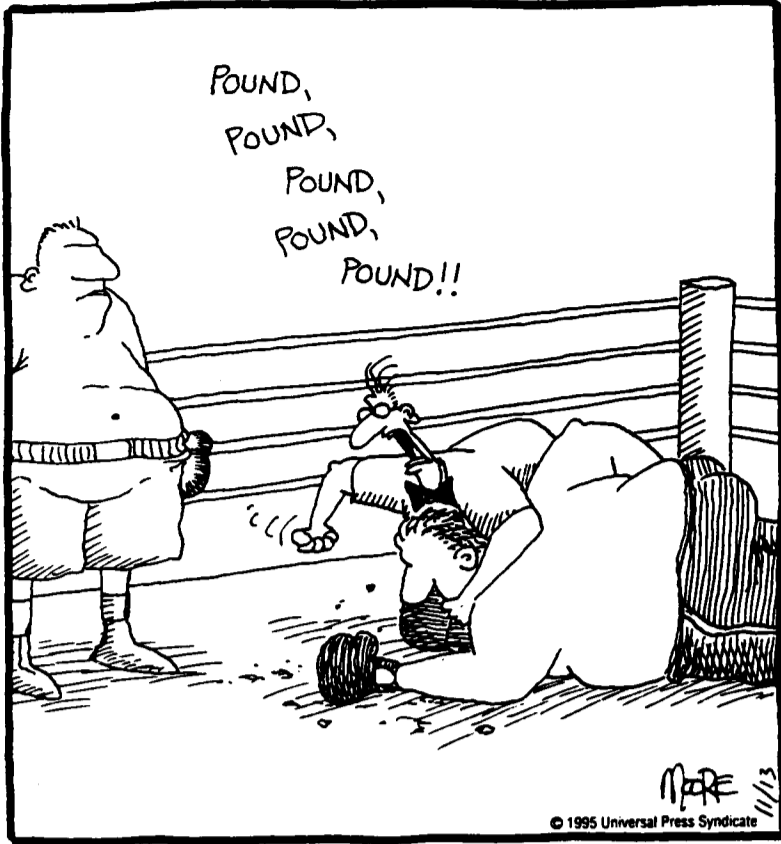

stay right where it belongs. The people of Cleveland deserve a team. They deserve the Browns. If the NFL cannot realize how well the team has been supported for all of these years and allow the Cleveland Browns to become the Baltimore Browns, nothing in football will ever be sacred again.

Art Modell's maneuvers show more loyalty to his wallet than faithful fans

The sign referred, of course, to Cleveland Browns owner Art Modell, who announced last week that he is moving the team to Baltimore.

The announcement sent a simple message to the rabid Browns fans who had supported the team through thick and thin for fifty years: Screw you.

Modell, in his search to stuff more money in his already fat pockets, has broken the hearts of the people who made him a millionaire. Modell has crushed the spirits of a city that only two weeks ago was on a World Series high.
