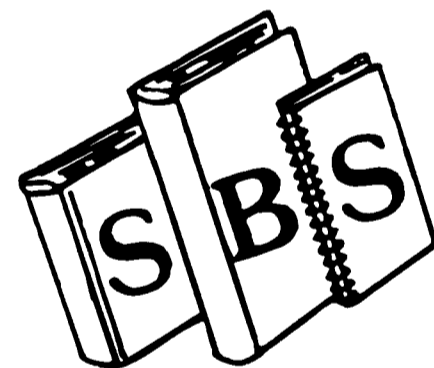

Baby delivered after mother shot to death in school bus

ST. LOUIS — A teen-ager waiting at a school bus stop with a pistol began firing after the bus doors swung open yesterday, killing a pregnant 15-year-old and wounding the driver before running away. The baby was in critical condition.

Dozens of police officers searched the city's north side for the gunman, who was believed to be 16 to 18. Police were unsure of a motive.

Police were also uncertain whether Kyunia Taylor, who was sitting in the first seat inside on her way to school, had been targeted or was shot at random.
