# Missing child may have been spotted in area

A child reported missing last March in Columbus, Ohio may have been seen July 12 on the Benner Pike, a news release from the State College Police Department said.

Three-year-old Aaron Codv Stepp was reported missing March 11. He is described as a white male with blond hair and blue eyes. When he was last seen he was 38 inches tall and 39 pounds.

On July 12, between 3 and 6 p.m., an individual reported seeing two women with a child fitting Stepp's description at DeFluri's Restaurant, 1225 Benner Pike.

The first individual is described as a white woman with shoulderlength dark hair and 130 pounds. Her estimated age is between 30

and 40. The second individual is described as an Asian or Pacific-Islander woman in her late teens or early 20s, with very short dark

hair and dark framed glasses. She is between 5 feet 4 inches and 5 feet 6 inches and 130 pounds, and was wearing blue jeans or blue-jean shorts.






