

Player of Week Award earned by Icers' Jaeger

Junior Icers forward Kevin Jaeger was named Div. I ACHA Player of the Week for his play against rival Ohio this past weekend.

Bonds, others to testify in grand jury hearing

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Barry Bonds will testify in December before a federal grand jury probing a laboratory that supplies some of the nation's top athletes with nutritional supplements.

The San Francisco Giants slugger is one of several dozen athletes who have been subpoenaed by the panel. Others include

Others include New York Yankees slugger Jason Giambi, sprint champion Kelli White and U.S. shot put champion Kevin Toth.

Bonds' attorney, Mike Rains, said Tuesday that his client received a sub-

poena about a month ago asking him to appear Dec. 4.

Rains said he was told by the prosecutor leading the investigation that "Barry is a witness and not a target of the grand jury."

The company at the center of the investigation is the Bay Area Laboratory Co-Operative, or BALCO, which was raided by the Internal Revenue Service and drug agents in September.

An attorney for BALCO founder Victor Conte confirmed Monday his client is the target of the grand jury probe.

The scope of the investigation is unclear, and federal officials have refused to comment.

Meanwhile, Conte has been accusedby the U.S. Anti-Doping Agency of supplying athletes with a new designer steroid that is rocking the world of track and field.

Bonds has been a BALCO client since 2000, and in the June issue of Muscle & Fitness magazine credited Conte for a personalized program that includes nutritional supplements. The home of Bonds' personal trainer, Greg Anderson, was raided last month in conjunction with the raid on Conte's lab.

"When Barry gets a grand jury subpoena and his trainer's door gets kicked in by drug enforcement agents, that's when I get involved," Rains told The Associated Press in a telephone interview Tuesday.

"All of that has certain ominous appearances to anybody."

McNair's drunk driving case goes to grand jury

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — Steve McNair's case on drunken driving and weapons charges will go to a grand jury.

Judge Leon Rubin ruled Tuesday that there was sufficient evidence for the case to move forward but there was no word on when the

grand jury convene. The Tennessee Titans' quarterback left with his lawyer after the hearing and did not talk to reporters.

McNair was pulled



over by police while driving a sport utility vehicle in Nashville just after midnight May 22.

Officer Shawn Taylor said he saw McNair's vehicle swerve across the center line.

According to police, McNair's eyes were bloodshot, his breath smelled of alcohol and he acknowledged that he had been drinking.

"There was no doubt in my mind he was impaired and a dangerous driver," Taylor testified during the preliminary hearing Tuesday.

Defense attorney Roger May said the police videotape never shows McNair swerving across the center line.

The officer said McNair drove across the line twice before he turned on the videotape.

Police said McNair's blood-alcohol level was 0.18 — well above Tennessee's limit of 0.10.

The weapon charge involves a 9 mm handgun found in the SUV.

McNair has a permit for the handgun, but an intoxicated person may not legally carry a loaded weapon.

McNair is the NFL's top-rated quarterback, and he has led the Titans to a 5-2 record.
