

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — J.R. Reed is back with the Philadelphia Eagles for his defense more than his return skills.

Released after his muffed punt led to a loss at Green Bay in the season opener, Reed re-signed with the Eagles yesterday to provide depth in

a banged-up secondary. All-Pro safety Brian Dawkins sustained a neck stringer in Monday night's 20-12 loss to Washington, and his status for Sunday's game against Detroit is uncertain. Starting free safety Sean Considine briefly left against the Redskins with a knee injury but returned.

Reed gives the Eagles four safeties on the roster.

Tackle Pat McCoy was released to make room for Reed. The Eagles also signed tackle Jonathan Palmer

to the practice squad and released tight end Lee Vickers. He signed with the Eagles on

Sept. 2 after getting cut by the Giants. Reed returned three kickoffs in the opener against the Packers. and was pressed into duty as a punt returner for the first time in his career after Greg Lewis lost a fumble and looked shaky.

Reed inexplicably tried to make a running catch on a punt in traffic and fumbled it, setting up the winning field goal. He was cut two days later when the Eagles brought back the sure-handed Reno Mahe.

SAN FRANCISCO (AP) — Barry Bonds said the man who bought his 756th home run ball and announced plans to let the public decide its fate is an "idiot."

Fashion designer Marc Ecko had

the winning bid Saturday in the online auction for the ball that Bonds hit last month to break Hank Aaron's record of 755 home runs.

The final selling price was \$752,467.



Ecko, 35, has set up a Web site allowing visitors to vote on three options for the ball: give it to the National Baseball Hall of Fame, brand it with an asterisk before sending it to Cooperstown or blast it into space on a rocket ship.
