

Olson suffered stroke in the past 12 months

TUCSON, Ariz. (AP) - Lute Olson's doctor said Tuesday that the former

Arizona basketball coach had a stroke within the last year and he advised him to retire.

The comments Dr. Steven Knope at a news conference called by Olson's family offer the first



Olson's sudden retirement last week. two days after he appeared at the Wildcats' media day. Olson said at the time he was energized and looking forward to his 25th season with Arizona.

Knope said an MRI confirmed the stroke in the frontal part of Olson's brain, which left the Hall of Famer with severe depression and impaired judgment.


