

Christian bands heat up BJC

Many attendees at Saturday's Winter Jam 2010 Tour Spectacular were already prepared for Sunday services.

"Am I the only one ready for church?" said NewSong lead singer Russ Lee to a burst of applause and screams. "Whoa, there's more going on here than just the ice cream at the Creamery!"

NewSong hosted the four-and-a-half-hour long concert at the Bryce Jordan Center, which was nearly filled to capacity. The show featured seven other Christian music acts, including bands like Third Day and Newsboys. University Park was the 12th stop on the 4-city tour.

Third Day — which held one of the larger time slots — performed songs like "Tunnel" and "Cry Out to Jesus." Lead singer Mac Powell was quick to point out the real reason behind Winter Jam.

"We're here to celebrate and gather together with our brothers and sisters in the faith," Powell said.

"I'll come back to this love we have for Jesus. We hope this arena has been a shelter tonight for

those who are struggling."

Guest speaker Tony Nolan also brought back the evening's message by leading some of the audience members in prayer and urging them not to cling to their sins.

Michael Tait, lead singer of the Newsboys, took a moment to acknowledge the recent earthquake in Haiti.

The band performed a cover of the Black Eyed Peas' "I Gotta Feeling" and original songs like "Dance," in which Tait implored audience members to get on their feet.

"Episcopalian, Catholic, Protestant... I don't care," Tait said. "I want to see you dance."

Concert organizers accepted a \$10 donation in lieu of tickets, inspiring many to line up hours before the show began.

Jeanie Maciejewski, 42, drove three-and-a-half hours from Lansdale, Pa., with her husband to attend. They waited outside of the BJC for three hours.

"I loved it, absolutely loved it," Maciejewski said. "I liked speaking about Jesus and hearing the gospel. We need more of it. This is definitely something everyone should experience."

As part of the evening's focus on charity, audience members were

asked to sponsor children through Holt International, an international adoption agency. A "love offering" to help fund the tour was also collected.

NewSong sold copies of its new CD, "Give Yourself Away," for \$15 — but accepted as little or as much as people could pay. Each CD came with a duplicate for people to give away to someone else.

Kaitlyn Ludgate, Class of 2009, said she was pleased with the low ticket price and NewSong's CD giveaway.

"The songs spoke to me," she said. "I'm just amazed that they can do this for \$10. I'm glad they brought the tour here to this community."

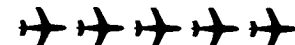
