

Lions head to Puerto Rico tournament

Penn State will compete in a Purdue-hosted tournament in Puerto Rico.

Members of the Penn State women's golf team are going to be getting more sun in four days than they would in an entire winter in State College.

The team is traveling to Rio Grande, Puerto Rico, Friday to compete in the 2010 Lady Puerto Rico Classic hosted by Purdue University, which starts Sunday.

The Nittany Lions, who have not played a competitive round of

golf since October, will face some of the toughest competition of the season in their first outing of 2010.

The team has spent the entire winter trapped within the walls of Holuba Hall, but the Lions aren't worried about it.

They are just excited to play on real grass, freshman Emily Ransone said.

"No, we don't have the warm weather advantage," Ransone said.

"But we are going in with a competitive attitude."

Nationally ranked teams like Alabama and Georgia will be in attendance, and the squads coming from the SEC will have an advantage over the teams

coming from a colder climate. But Penn State coach Denise St. Pierre said that the other teams are simply not a concern for the Lions.

Purdue women's golf coach Devon Brouse is responsible for the annual Puerto Rico trip.

Brouse coached at North Carolina for 22 years, where hosting the trip to Puerto Rico became a tradition.

When he became the Boilermakers' coach, he didn't change anything.

He has taken the Purdue women's team to Puerto Rico for seven years.

"It's an extremely attractive venue in February," Brouse said. "And I know this tournament is one of the girls always look back on."

The Cocoa Beach Resort is the host site and has been for the last four years.

Brouse said the resort will be hosting a PGA tournament shortly after the Invitational.

He is a fan of the course's 6,219 yards worth of coated form of sea

salt Bermuda grass and so is his team — the defending champions.

St. Pierre has been to Puerto Rico to play in events before but never with her current roster. Giulia Carando, Katherine Murphy, Sky Seo, Gia Panelli and Ransone will represent the Lions. They will play three complete rounds, one each day.

The girls are looking forward to getting outside on real turf and are looking forward to catching some rays out on the golf course.

Ransone joked about how golf tan lines can be funny looking, especially when it looks like a glove is still on after the golfer has taken it off.

"But hey," Ransone said. "We are proud of those tans."
