In October 1998, 21-year-old college student Matthew Shepard was kidnapped, beaten, left for a few days in Laramie, Wyoming, and left to die. Five weeks later, Moses Kaufman and fellow members of Tectonic Theater Project went to Laramie, where they conducted more than 200 interviews. From those interviews and their own insights, they wrote *The Laramie Project*, which has become one of the most influential plays of our time. A decade after Shepard's death, Tectonic members went back to Laramie to ask more questions. The results form the basis of a sequel.
