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# **GUNNING IT** Bolden struggling for time in the pocket

In Penn State's three losses this season, freshman quarterback Rob Bolden has been pressured for time to throw while playing under center and in the shotgun formation. While the shotgun should give a quarterback more time to throw in distancing him five yards from the line of scrimmage. Bolden's completion percentages have not differed much hetween the two formations.

The best conclusion shows pressure and blitz packages from Alabama, Iowa and Illinois and the Penn State offensive line's inability to protect have made the shotgun, and the added time it gives, Bolden much time to throw. virtually irrelevant.

### Behind center

Bolden operating behind center has seen an opposing, up-anddown trend.

The freshman completed 33 percent of his passes behind center in Alabama, 54 percent in Iowa and 42 percent against Illinois

In all but one case, the statistics higher his percentage becomes. Bolden presumably gets into a better rhythm the more he throws the ball.

those three double-digit losses. Bolden was hit on three of his

four interceptions and generally forced throws under pressure something usually seen from an inexperienced quarterback instead of taking the sack or throwing the ball away.

Bolden has attempted 15 more throws from behind center. The Lions could be more unpredictable if there was balance between the two formations.

#### Shotgun

Bolden has felt the pressure this season.

Though keeping opponents to five sacks, the Penn State offensive line generally hasn't given

In the Nittany Lions' three losses this season, Bolden completed 50 percent of his passes from the shotgun, only five percent better than his 45-percent completion percentage behind center in those three games.

From the shotgun, Bolden's completion percentage has steadily declined throughout the losses.

The offensive line isn't always to show the more Bolden throws, the blame. Dropped balls and errant passes also played into the equation, but the shotgun didn't necessarily translate into less pressure.
