Men's, women's cross country heading to NC

In the final kick of his 10,000meter race, Kyle Dawson had little energy left.

But he had enough for a final push, passing Princeton's Brian Leung and teammate Vince McNally, finishing for a 30 minute, 6 second second-place finish.

Dawson and McNally's 2-3 punch couldn't get Penn State's men's cross country team into the top-two at Saturday's Mid-Atlantic regional meet, but the team's performance at the Blue-White Golf Course was enough to advance to the Nov. 22 NCAA Championships.

The men failed to live up to their No. 2 regional ranking and placed fourth while the women upset No.

earn a trip to the NCAAs. The topfour men's and women's teams in the region earned a bid to the tournament — no other region had more teams qualify.

Coach Beth Alford-Sullivan said the races from both teams were impressive despite racing in what she considers perhaps the hardest region in the country.

Dawson and McNally stayed out front for the men, while the women remained in a pack through the first half before junior captain Caitlin Lane advanced. narrowly missing the top-10 with a 12th-place finish.

The Nittany Lions later earned the 20-22 spots from junior captain Millhouse, sophomore Kara Natalie Bower and senior Maura

Alford-Sullivan said the women ran "out of their minds," in the first time she has seen Penn State earn five spots in the top 25.

we got as many Princeton girls as we could," Lane said. "It was hard - I think every girl finished on the ground. It just shows that every girl worked harder and gave it all they've got."

In one of the biggest late-race kicks of the day, Ryan pushed her way from 30th to 22nd with less than a half-mile to go.

Ryan said she hoped for a top-25 finish before the race, and with teammates and coaches yelling out her position, she had something left to give toward the end.

"At one point I was 27th and they told me I had to catch the Princeton girl, so finally I got into the top-25," Ryan said. "The last half-mile is my favorite because I think, 'Oh, it's just 800 [meters].

"We all had a goal, to make sure that's what I usually run.' I tried to kick the last mile, because I didn't want anyone to take that place from me.

During the season, Penn State's women earned wins against automatic NCAA-qualifier Rice, while the men beat then-No. 5 Alabama, Notre Dame and Villanova — giving both teams enough points for their NCAA bids.

The men's team gathered Sund. / evening to see the selections together, which captain Chris Cipro said was exciting after being shut out in 2009.

"It was definitely a huge deal. Last year was such a disappointment and we knew we were so much better," Cipro said.
