

True freshman Alton dominating with pins

All it takes is an instant. In just one instant, the match is over and Andrew Alton is standing in the center of the mat, his arm held high in victory by the referee. The true freshman is on a tear this season, sitting undefeated at 11-0 in his first year of collegiate action and making a living pinning his opponents. "He's phenomenal, there's no doubt about it," redshirt freshman David Taylor said of Alton. "Him being able to pin people, as the season goes on it's gonna make good guys wrestle him a lot different."

In his 11 matches this season, Alton is leading the Nittany Lions with nine pins. His fastest pin of the year came in just 21 seconds. This past Sunday at the Nittany Lion Open, Alton put his pinning ability on display before the more than 400 wrestlers in attendance at Rec Hall. En route to his 141-pound title at

the Open, Alton went 6-0 with five pins. His only scare came in the third round before the quarterfinals, a 7-5 decision over North Carolina's Danny Lopes. "I like to stay calm and relaxed," Alton said. "I try not to get too built up to wrestle, too warmed up and then go out there and lose all my energy. I just try to stay relaxed all day."

Though he was focusing on conserving his energy throughout the day, Alton didn't need to use much of it in his 141-pound final on Sunday, pinning No. 20 Zach Kemerer of Penn in just 39 seconds to take the championship.

Knowing Kemerer had strong single-leg and high-crotch moves, Alton countered with an effective move of his own. "He got in there pretty quick, but I got the underhook," Alton said. "I went to my side, went over and pinned him."

That move, the underhook, has become Alton's bread and butter move this season. By sweeping his leg behind his opponent's leg, Alton can knock his opponent off his balance and easily take him to the mat. From there Alton can stay on top, force the pin, and walk away victorious as he's been doing all season.

"He can pin a guy from so many different positions with that one move," Taylor said. "So guys are gonna have to respect that."

"And he's just going to keep getting better and better."
