P. R. R. Investigates Dynamite Outrage

Series of Small Explosions Lead to Discovery of Attempt to Wreck Train.

Altoona, Pa., July 12-Pennsylvania Railroad detectives are investigating today what appears to have been a deliberate attempt to either destroy railroad property or to wreck trains at Bellwood, seven miles east of here, late last night.

Shortly before midnight while a local train from Harrisburg was passing a water station west of Bellwood station there was a terrific explosion and an investigation revealed that a heavy charge of dynamite had been put off with a time fuse.

Later railroad detectives and signal men found eighty-six of dynamite, done up in packages containing eight to ten sticks were scattered over the four tracks and some of the explosive was found in a water trough between the tracks. Shortly before two o'clock this morning there was a scond explosion about 150 feet from the Bellwood station, and still later


