Atso-That in the fourth section of the Act of Assembly entitled "An Act relating to executions, and for other purposes," approved April 16th, 1840, it is enacted that the aforesaid 14th section "shall not be construed, as to prevent any militia officer or borough officer, from sersing as judge, inspector or clerk, at any general or special election in this Commonwealth." And in and by an Act of the General Assem-

bly of this State, passed the 2d day of July, 1839, it is directed that the Inspectors and Judges be at the places of their districts on the day of the General Election aforesaid, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to do and perform the several duties required and cujoined on them in and by the same act.

And be it further directed, in and by the Act of the General Assembly of this State, aforesaid,

that one of the Judges of each of the different districts aforesaid, who shall have the charme of the certificates of the number of votes which shall have been given for each candidate for the different offices then and there voted for at their respective districts, shall meet the third-day after the election, which shall be on Parthen and there to make a fair statement and certificate of the number of votes, which shall have been given at the different districts in the county of Adams for any persons for the offices. aforesaid.
