DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM. Resolutions of the Democratic National Convention, adopted July 4, 1862.

WHEREAS, The American Constitution was ordained and established in order to form a more perfect Union, establish justice, ensure domestic tranquility, provide for the common defence, promote the general welfare, and secure the blessings of liberty to posterity; therefore:

1st. Resolved, That the only object of the Democratic party is the restoration of the Union as it was, the preservation of the Constitution, and the enforcement of the laws.

2d. Resolved, That to the end that the Union be restored, and the Constitution and laws enforced throughout its whole extent, we pledge our hearty and unqualified support to the Federal Government in the energetic prosecution of the existing war.

3d. Resolved, That the true and only object of the war is to restore the Union and enforce the laws. Such a purpose alone is worthy the noblest and noblest of the human mind.
