

Governor Curtin's Message.

EXECUTIVE CHAMBER. HARRISBURG, Pa., Jan. 10, 1865. To the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Since my last annual message the war has been prosecuted with vigor and vigor. The three contributions to Pennsylvania to the National Army, but a few of the men now remain in the service.

My first inaugural address, I took occasion to declare that Pennsylvania would, under any circumstances, render a full and determined support to the restoration of the Union.

The number of troops furnished the service, from Pennsylvania, during the rebellion, may be stated as follows: 180,000 men.

This statement is exclusive of militia and enlistments for the United States Navy.

I refer for more perfect details of all the military operations of the war to the reports of the Adjutant General of the other military departments of the State and to my previous annual messages.

An approximate judgment of the amount of labor performed by these departments, and in the office of the Secretary of the Commonwealth, may be made when it is stated that 400 Pennsylvania volunteers were discharged.

Proceeding in the strict line of duty, the reports of the military departments, which have been heretofore published, are hereby reprinted, and the history of the conduct of our people in the field, illuminated with incidents of heroism worthy of conspicuous notice.
