Section 8. Court House and Jail. The New Berlin Plans.

In a New Berlin Star of last February is a carefully-prepared article which reads as follows: "Union county is sadly behind the majority of her sister counties in the matter of convenience of her public edifices..."

This is the New Berlin, Anti-Division design. And suppose "those buildings fall," and we have new ones, similar to those of our "sister counties," to be paid by taxes: what would be the expense?

Messrs. Seibold, Roshong, Swineford, Wilson and Schoch, the New Berlin Anti-Division Committee, estimate the cost of a new Court House, &c., at over \$27,000. The New Berlin Times of May 5th, puts down \$39,000 as the cost for Grounds, Court House, Jail, &c., for each new county.

The Star's estimates are about as large. If the New Berliners would expend \$50,000 or \$40,000 each for the two counties, they would expend double that sum for the county as it is, undivided. Nothing short of \$60,000 or \$70,000 buildings would, (from this voluntary exhibit of the New Berlin committee and papers), "strike off a foul stain on the fair face of the county."

Remember, all of this is to be paid by taxation! Remember, too, that this plan was thought to be sprung upon you, last Winter, without your knowledge. And remember, also, that if you elect a Commissioner in the New Berlin interest, he may aid in getting a Grand Jury that will, ere you are aware, saddle this heavy burden on you.

Two-Pagers, which project to you a view of what you are voting for. If you vote against Division, you vote upon yourself (according to the estimate of the New Berlin people) \$50,000, at least, for Court House, &c., as the "sister counties" of York, Berks, Lancaster and Schuylkill have done.

The Issue. Probably not two in ten of the citizens of Union county, in their sober judgment, believe that New Berlin is the proper place for the Seat of Justice. Nature has so formed the Middlecreek and Buffalo Valleys, that they drain much the largest portion of our county; and upon them and along the river, nine-tenths of the business is transacted.

But where in Buffalo Valley, or where in Middlecreek Valley, shall the County Seat be? Evidently, for either side of the Mountain to go to the other, is impracticable—a burden too heavy to be endured. A Division is the only rational result, and will, sooner or later, be arrived at.

The first issue will be, to divide; and the second, to locate the Seat of Justice. Five-sixths of those in the North end of the county, would rather go to Millburg or to Lewisburg than to New Berlin. Lewisburg would prefer Millburg to New Berlin, and Millburg would prefer Lewisburg to New Berlin.

On the South side of the mountain, a large majority would prefer either Selinsgrove, Chapman, Freeburg or Middleburg to New Berlin; and most of them would prefer either of the four to New Berlin. But here New Berlin displays her long practiced adroitness, by endeavoring to excite jealousy between the friends of the different points named.
