N. B. against K. N. The New Berlin Star this week "breaks out in a new spot," and is vehemently and indignantly clamorous for the American party to throw open their council chambers and proclaim their principles to the world; and hints that they have done some wonderful bad things in their day.

If the Star has not yet learned the principles of the Americans—which have been ardently applauded by the Star for a year past—we doubt whether the sudden blindness which has come over it can ever be removed.

What the new party has performed for the good of Liberty, Temperance, Tariff, and against Jesuitism, let its short history tell. As to its "secrecy" &c., the K. N.'s are no more secret or wire-pulling than the New Berlin Clowns have been for years past; the N. B.'s, and the K. N.'s both "fix sings" to suit themselves, and come out and announce their candidate or nominee when they please, and as they please.

As to tricking and intriguing, we would put N. B. against "Sam" any day.

(Since writing the above, it has been suggested to us that the K. N.'s are not now more secret in their exchanges of opinion as to who they shall nominate for President, than the N. B.'s are in trying to find some way to defeat Division. It is also suggested that the Whig "Star" is merely paying the way for another "Fusion" ticket with the Democratic "Times.")

Among the business before the Legislature, we noticed a Senate bill for the repeal of part of an act incorporating the borough of Millburg—a petition to change the place of elections in Center Tp—and a bill to establish the line between Union and Juniata counties. Old Union having assigned to young Snyder all her rights on the Juniata frontier, it becomes their interest to see to it that the Juniata county members in each House don't "fix that line more for the advantage of Juniata than of Snyder.

Some members of the Union county bar have petitioned to be annexed to the Middle District of the Supreme Court.

A further supplement to the common school law, recommended by the Department, passed in Senate.

The Governor vetoed the Stroudsburg Bank bill, referring to his message relative to a bank at Pocono, for his objections.

The Potomac Ledger admits that Gov. Pollock's views of the impolicy of any considerable increase of banking capital, are correct, but thinks that town is entitled to a bank by reason of its large business wants. Every locality however puts forth the same plea, so that the Governor has to select and decide according to his own view of the general good.

The Harrisburg Morning Herald of a recent date says pretty plainly, that if the Legislature can't elect the Senators—and can't provide for the sale of the public Works—(both of which they were especially entitled to perform.) the best thing they can do is to pass the most moderate Appropriation Bill possible, and make way for their successors. And a Jury of the People would respond, "So say we all!"

The Governor has conferred upon Wm. Laird Harris, of East Buffalo, the honorary title of Aide-Camp, with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Col. Harris won his honor by hard and faithful labors.

The "Berwick Gazette" has again reappeared, under the charge of Levi F. Irwin & Co. As the head of the firm announces in the first No. that he has taken one of Columbia's daughters to wife, we can but hope that this good beginning will insure a more firm continuance of a news-journal in Berwick. Success to the "Co."

Postage Regulations. POST OFFICE DEPARTMENT. Appointment Office, March 22, 1855.

Sir: Your letter of the 20th inst. is received. In answer, I am directed by the Postmaster General to inform you—1. The set of the 24 March, 1855, making no provision for unpaid letters to places within the United States, on the same or day following any such unpaid letter or letters being put into a post office, the postmaster thereof will put up conspicuously in his office a list of the same stating that they are held for postage. If not attended to, such letters must be returned monthly to the Dead Letter Office.

2. Letters part paid should be dispatched charged with the additional postage due at the pre-paid rate, according to distance, established by said act, except where the omission to pay the correct amount is known to have been intentional, when they should be treated the same as letters wholly unpaid.

3. It is proper to forward a letter when requested in writing. When forwarded no additional postage should be charged if the letter, contrary to its address, has been misdirected. If it has been sent according to its address, and then forwarded, it must be charged with additional postage at the pre-paid rate, according to distance, established by the act of 24 March, 1855, aforesaid.

4. Ship letters, as they can not be prepaid, and are not supposed to be embraced in the new act, will continue to be dispatched agreeably in the provisions of the fifteenth section of the act of 24 March 1855.

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY.—A meeting was held in Williamsport, on the 24th ult., to take measures for the formation of an Agricultural Society in that county. A series of resolutions defining the duties of the officers, and providing for the permanent organization of the Society were adopted. Another meeting is to be held on Tuesday evening of the first day of May next.

The Catawissa, Williamsport and Erie Railroad Company, have contracted with Mr. Gould, the President of the Susquehanna Telegraph Company, for the erection of telegraphic wires along their line. The work is to be commenced as soon as the frost is out of the ground.

The State Penitentiary of Tennessee, was destroyed by fire on Wednesday morning of last week. One convict, named Conner, was smothered to death by the smoke. The loss in the buildings and tools, &c., is estimated at \$100,000.

Cattle are dying in many parts of New York and Ohio, for want of food. Hay is selling at \$20 per ton. We also hear, of late, much complaint in this region, on account of the scarcity of fodder.—Berwick Argus.

CENSUS OF KANSAS.—A complete enumeration of the voting population in Kansas has been obtained. It seems to contain 3,096 electors, which are divided into seventeen election districts.
