Editorial Correspondence of Lewisburg Chronicle.

HARRISBURG, May 24, 1855.

Governor Pollock and Secretary Curtin are still in Philadelphia. The Governor has visited a large number of the Public Schools, and by his address, and personal intercourse with teachers and pupils of various grades, has endorsed the cause of education to some purpose.

The Supreme Court of the State is in session at this place. It is expected that the motion for granting a new trial to Dr. Beale will be up in a day or two.

The Annual Volume of Laws passed by our State Legislature will be ready for distribution in three weeks. This is four months ahead of the usual time, and will be good news to all who have any desire to know, without great expense and trouble, what bills were perfected into laws, and their precise terms.

Candidates. Under the Division Law, Union county is entitled to elect next fall, 1 Associate Judge, 3 Commissioners, 1 Sheriff, 1 Treasurer, 1 Prosecuting Attorney, 1 Auditor, 1 Surveyor, and 1 Coroner—10 officers.

Snyder county would have to elect 2 Associate Judges, 3 Commissioners, 1 Sheriff, 1 Prothonotary, 1 Register & Recorder, 1 Treasurer, 1 Prosecuting Attorney, 1 Surveyor, 3 Auditors, and 1 Coroner—15 officers.

Finances of the State. TREASURY OFFICE, Harrisburg, May 19, 1855.

To the Treasurer and Commissioners of the several Counties of Pennsylvania. GENTLEMEN: You are doubtless aware, that the semi-annual interest on the funded debt of this Commonwealth falls due on the first day of August next. I feel impelled under a sense of duty to call your attention to the necessity of prompt and immediate action to secure an early payment of the taxes due the State.

The reputation and honor of the State are in a great measure committed to your keeping; it is upon the tax due from the several counties, that I rely mainly for the means of making payment. I am aware that the late stringency in the monetary affairs of the country, has greatly crippled the Manufacturing and Commercial interests of the State, that the general drought and consequent failure of last year's crops has deprived the Farmer of his usual ability to pay, and that owing to these adverse circumstances, it will require on your part a more than usual effort to collect promptly. I know that the highest incitement to duty that can be placed before the people of this Commonwealth, is to assure them that the honor of the Commonwealth demands such duty at their hands.

While I would hold up this higher motive to you, and through you to the people, I would also remind you that by the act of Assembly of the 29th day of April, 1844, it is provided that "Any county paying into the State Treasury its quota of tax levied on its adjusted valuation, fifteen days prior to the first day of August in any year, such county shall be entitled to an abatement of FIVE PER CENT. upon the amount so paid." I am disposed to give this law a fair and liberal construction. Where the whole amount has not been paid, but an amount approaching near to the whole, the deduction of FIVE PER CENT. will be made. I would suggest the propriety of following the statement of five per cent. by the tax collector immediately to the tax payer, believing that such a course will incite to a more prompt payment than when the benefits are made to accrue to the County Treasury.

You will confer a great favor upon me, by letting me know as early a date as it will be possible for you to do so, with any reasonable degree of certainty, what amount of money you will be able to furnish, and at what time. Yours Respectfully, BLISSLER, State Treasurer.

Treason in Missouri and Kansas. Chicago, May 18.—The St. Louis Democrat of yesterday publishes a long letter from Geo. S. Park, late of the Parkville Luminary, in which he says that Messrs. Stringfellow and Atchison have organized a secret association, sworn to turn out and fight when called upon, and all to share the dangers accruing to any one member, even at the price of disunion. They act secretly to destroy the business and character of all Northern men. All the Benton and Whig presses are to be destroyed. The destruction of the hotel at Kansas, and the presses at Lawrence, has been decreed, and cannon are being taken to demolish them at a distance. They have declared they will not stop till every Free Soiler is driven out of Missouri and Kansas.

Mr. Park says he telegraphed to Gov. Price of Missouri, and to Pres. Pierce, claiming protection, but no answer was given. He traces to Mr. Atchison, the destruction of the Luminary establishment, and proceeds still further developments.

Foreign News.

New York, May 18.—The Steamship Baltic from Liverpool, arrived this evening at 5 o'clock, 40 minutes, bringing dates to the 9th instant.

The advices from Sebastopol are to the 4th inst. The Allies were steadily gaining ground, having captured all the Russian outworks.

Sanguinary encounters were frequent, and a large number of Russian mortars had been taken, and many prisoners.

Nothing has yet occurred in the siege to warrant an assault.

The Emperor Napoleon narrowly escaped assassination on the evening of the 25th ult. An Italian fired two pistols at him while out on horseback. Personal revenge was the only object.

The bombardment of Sebastopol had much slackened, and had not produced the results anticipated.

The position of the Allies was regarded as critical, notwithstanding the advantages gained. An immense Russian force is reported as concentrating near Sebastopol. It is said to be 160,000 strong.

Daily telegraphic communication with the Crimea continued, but the English government is cautious with the news.

Numerous reinforcements are constantly reaching the Allies.

The French reserve of 80,000 men, near Constantine, was expected to be sent to Balaklava.

The Russian official accounts to the 24th, represent the damage sustained from the bombardment as of little account and actively repaired, while the skirmishes were generally successful.

CINCINNATI, May 21.—Elijah Williams, a rich planter of Barnesville, South Carolina, arrived here to-day with eight slaves, one of whom was his wife, another his wife's mother, and six his children, his purpose being to manumit the whole family and settle them in this State; but just as he was stepping from the steamboat into the carriage, he fell dead. The slaves having been brought here, are, of course, free under our State laws. Williams had previously willed the whole of his estate to them.

THE COST OF LIVING IN WASHINGTON. —The best flour is retained at eleven dollars and seventy-five cents a barrel; good butter is forty cents a pound; eggs eighteen cents a dozen; hams twelve to fourteen cents a pound; best fifteen cents; good Irish potatoes seventy-five cents a peck; herring twenty-five cents a dozen; perch thirty-cent and a quarter cents a bunch; a rock fish large enough to boil, thirty-eight cents; apples fifty to seventy-five cents a peck; dried apples fifty cents; dried peaches seventy-five cents.

MATCH CHURCH, May 21.—Two boatmen, named Linderman, (brothers,) belonging to Catsaque, were found dead yesterday morning in the cabin of their boat, lying at the wharf in this place, having been suffocated from coal gas. They had closed the cabin and lighted a fire before going to sleep. Only one of them was married, and leaves a wife and child.

EASTON, May 21.—The work upon the Tunnel on the Warren Railroad near Belvidere, has been recommenced. Sheldon's Mountain bore which was lately injured by fire, has been repaired, and is again in successful operation in the tunnel.

The 1100 acres of M. J. R. Roybold's property, in Kent Co., Md., sold at an average of \$61 per acre—superior land for that region.
